A part of an object or surface.
*The **area** of a triangle.*

<u>arena</u>	A large structure for open-air sports or entertainments. <i>He has re entered the political arena.</i>
department	A specialized division of a large organization. <i>He was a bit lacking in the height department.</i>
domain	An area of territory owned or controlled by a particular ruler or government. <i>The French domains of the Plantagenets.</i>
<u>field</u>	The force exerted or potentially exerted in a field. <i>A football field.</i>
<u>kingdom</u>	A monarchy with a king or queen as head of state. <i>The untroubled kingdom of reason.</i>
land	Living or travelling on land rather than in water or the air. <i>A land force.</i>
monarchy	A state that has a monarch. <i>The monarchy is the focus of loyalty and service.</i>
<u>region</u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>The lumbar region.</i>
sovereign state	A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right.
sphere	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>He sometimes took out his telescope to make sure the spheres were still revolving in good order.</i>

- borough** A municipal corporation in certain US states.
- constituency** A group of people with shared interests or political opinions.
*Most politicians are more interested in the voice of their **constituency**.*
- county** A sporting team playing for a county.
*Administration at **county** level.*

equatorial	Of, at, or near the equator. <i>Equatorial regions.</i>
geographic	Determined by geography. <i>The north and south geographic poles.</i>
geographical	Determined by geography. <i>Geographical research.</i>
geography	The nature and relative arrangement of places and physical features. <i>The geography of post war London.</i>
littoral	The littoral zone. <i>The littoral states of the Indian Ocean.</i>
local	A local train or bus service. <i>Migration can regulate the local density of animals.</i>
locality	An area or neighbourhood. <i>A working class locality.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its municipal law.</i>
municipality	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each municipality choose between four candidates.</i>
neighborhood	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>My neighborhood voted for Bush.</i>
northern	Situated in or oriented toward the north. <i>A northern snowstorm.</i>
peninsular	Of or forming or resembling a peninsula. <i>The counties of peninsular Florida.</i>
prefecture	The official residence or headquarters of a prefect. <i>Enraged fans besieged the Prefecture of Police.</i>

<u>province</u>	A territory outside Italy under a Roman governor. <i>I made my way home to the dreary provinces by train.</i>
<u>region</u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>His work takes needlework into the region of folk art.</i>
regional	A stamp, newspaper, or other thing produced or used in a particular region. <i>Regional variations.</i>
southern	Situated in the south or directed towards or facing the south. <i>A southern exposure.</i>
subdivide	Divide into smaller and smaller pieces. <i>The cells subdivided.</i>
<u>territory</u>	An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport. <i>Woodland territory.</i>
zone	Designate a specific area for use or development as a particular zone in planning. <i>The land is zoned for housing.</i>
