<a href="#"><u>field</u></a>	The force exerted or potentially exerted in a field. <i>A football <b>field</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>kingdom</u></a>	A monarchy with a king or queen as head of state. <i>The untroubled <b>kingdom</b> of reason.</i>
<b>land</b>	Living or travelling on land rather than in water or the air. <i>A <b>land</b> force.</i>
<b>monarchy</b>	A state that has a monarch. <i>The <b>monarchy</b> is the focus of loyalty and service.</i>
<a href="#"><u>region</u></a>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>The lumbar <b>region</b>.</i>
<b>sovereign state</b>	A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right.
<b>sphere</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>He sometimes took out his telescope to make sure the <b>spheres</b> were still revolving in good order.</i>

<b>equatorial</b>	Of, at, or near the equator. <i><b>Equatorial</b> regions.</i>
<b>geographic</b>	Determined by geography. <i>The north and south <b>geographic</b> poles.</i>
<b>geographical</b>	Determined by geography. <i><b>Geographical</b> research.</i>
<b><u>geography</u></b>	The nature and relative arrangement of places and physical features. <i>The <b>geography</b> of post war London.</i>
<b>littoral</b>	The littoral zone. <i>The <b>littoral</b> states of the Indian Ocean.</i>
<b><u>local</u></b>	A local train or bus service. <i>Migration can regulate the <b>local</b> density of animals.</i>
<b>locality</b>	An area or neighbourhood. <i>A working class <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its <b>municipal</b> law.</i>
<b>municipality</b>	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each <b>municipality</b> choose between four candidates.</i>
<b><u>neighborhood</u></b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>My <b>neighborhood</b> voted for Bush.</i>
<b>northern</b>	Situated in or oriented toward the north. <i>A <b>northern</b> snowstorm.</i>
<b>peninsular</b>	Of or forming or resembling a peninsula. <i>The counties of <b>peninsular</b> Florida.</i>
<b>prefecture</b>	The official residence or headquarters of a prefect. <i>Enraged fans besieged the <b>Prefecture</b> of Police.</i>



<b><u>province</u></b>	A territory outside Italy under a Roman governor. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<b><u>region</u></b>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>His work takes needlework into the <b>region</b> of folk art.</i>
<b>regional</b>	A stamp, newspaper, or other thing produced or used in a particular region. <i><b>Regional</b> variations.</i>
<b>southern</b>	Situated in the south or directed towards or facing the south. <i>A <b>southern</b> exposure.</i>
<b>subdivide</b>	Divide into smaller and smaller pieces. <i>The cells <b>subdivided</b>.</i>
<b><u>territory</u></b>	An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport. <i>Woodland <b>territory</b>.</i>
<b>zone</b>	Designate a specific area for use or development as a particular zone in planning. <i>The land is <b>zoned</b> for housing.</i>
