Do over, as of (part of) a house. reconstruct

Later emperors **reconstruct**ed the army.

Make new. refashion

The industry reshaped and **refashion**ed itself.

Make new. remake

The bed would be more comfortable if it were remade.

Do over, as of (part of) a house. remodel

She **remodel**led the head with careful fingers.



renovate Give new life or energy to.

My wife wants us to **renovate**.

**restore** Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken.

**Restore** the forest to its original pristine condition.

To patch up or renovate; repair or restore.

An attempt to **revamp** the museum s image.



# Usage Examples of "Rebuild" as a verb

- After the earthquake people set about rebuilding their homes.
- We try to help them rebuild their lives.
- The house was rebuild after it was hit by a bomb.

**ferroconcrete** Concrete reinforced with steel.

**forestry** Country covered by forests.

**forge** A blacksmith's workshop; a smithy.

He **forge**d ahead.

Putting seeds or young plants in the ground to grow.

He ordered the **planting** of policemen outside every doorway.

**privatize**Change from governmental to private control or ownership.

They were opposed to plans to **privatize** electricity and water.

recast Cast again, in a different role.

She had to **recast** her image to please the electorate in her home state.

**reconstitute** Construct or form anew or provide with a new structure.

The governing board was **reconstitute**d.

Reorganize (something.

reconstruct

Later emperors reconstructed the army.

The action or process of reconstructing or being reconstructed.

**reconstruction** A **reconstruction** of the accident would be staged to try to discover the

cause of the tragedy.

reestablish

Bring back into original existence, use, function, or position.

**Reestablish** peace in the region.

**reforestation** The process of replanting an area with trees.

The need for post fire **reforestation**.

refurbish Make brighter and prettier.

The premises have been completely **refurbish**ed in our corporate style.



**reinstate**Restore to the previous state or rank.

The union threatened strike action if Owen was not **reinstate**d.

remodel Shape (a figure or object) again or differently.

She **remodel**led the head with careful fingers.

**remold** Give new treads to (a tire.

The imposition of a new organization; organizing differently (often

reorganization involving extensive and drastic changes.

Many firms are facing massive **reorganization**s.

reshape Shape again or shape differently.

The decrees will thoroughly **reshape** Poland s economy.

Interchange the positions of (members of a team, especially government

reshuffle ministers.

The president was forced to **reshuffle** his cabinet.

**restore** Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken.

Restore law and order.

Convert (the debt of a business in difficulty) into another kind of debt,

**restructure** typically one that is repayable at a later time.

A plan to strengthen and **restructure** the EC.

**seedling** A young plant, especially one raised from seed and not from a cutting.
