### Definitions of "Receiver" as a noun

- *A player who specializes in catching passes.*
- *A complete telephone handset.*
- *The tennis player who receives the serve.*
- *A football player who catches (or is supposed to catch) a forward pass.*
- *The part of a firearm which houses the action and to which the barrel and other parts are attached.*
- *Set that receives radio or tv signals.*
- *A piece of radio or television apparatus that detects broadcast signals and converts them into visible or audible form.*
- *A person who gets or accepts something that has been sent or given to them.*
- *(law) a person (usually appointed by a court of law) who liquidates assets or preserves them for the benefit of affected parties.*
- *A person who buys or accepts goods known to be stolen.*
- *(in tennis and similar games) the player to whom the ball is served to begin play.*
- *A person who receives something.*
- *Earphone that converts electrical signals into sounds.*

- A person (usually appointed by a court of law) who liquidates assets or preserves them for the benefit of affected parties.
- A person or company appointed by a court to manage the financial affairs of a business or person that has gone bankrupt.
- A container for collecting the products of distillation, chromatography, or other process.
- The part of a telephone apparatus contained in the earpiece, in which electrical signals are converted into sounds.



## Synonyms of "Receiver" as a noun (10 Words)

<b>apparatus</b>	Equipment designed to serve a specific function. <i>The <b>apparatus</b> of government.</i>
<b>beneficiary</b>	The recipient of funds or other benefits.
<b>donee</b>	The recipient of funds or other benefits.
<b>giftee</b>	The recipient of a gift. <i>Certificates can be sent to you or directly to the <b>giftee</b>.</i>
<b>handset</b>	A mobile phone. <i>Many stolen <b>handsets</b> are believed to end up in Eastern Europe.</i>
<b>liquidator</b>	A person (usually appointed by a court of law) who liquidates assets or preserves them for the benefit of affected parties.

- pass catcher** A flight or run by an aircraft over a target.
- pass receiver** Success in satisfying a test or requirement.
- recipient** A person who receives something.  
*The **recipient** of the Nobel Peace Prize.*
- telephone receiver** Electronic equipment that converts sound into electrical signals that can be transmitted over distances and then converts received signals back into sounds.

- *He's the biggest receiver of stolen jewels in London.*
- *He picked up the receiver.*
- *The company is in the hands of the receivers.*





## Associations of "Receiver" (30 Words)

<b>addressee</b>	The person to whom something is addressed. <i>The contents of the letters were calculated to cause distress to the individual <b>addressee</b>.</i>
<b>assignee</b>	The party to whom something is assigned (e.g., someone to whom a right or property is legally transferred).
<b>broadcast</b>	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <i>They regularly <b>broadcast</b> on Radio 2.</i>
<b><u>bulletin</u></b>	Make public by bulletin.
<b><u>camera</u></b>	A device for recording visual images in the form of photographs, film, or video signals. <i>A video <b>camera</b>.</i>

<b>commentary</b>	An expression of opinions or offering of explanations about an event or situation. <i>A live <b>commentary</b> on radio.</i>
<b>communication</b>	A letter or message containing information or news. <i>There was a lack of <b>communication</b> between Pamela and her parents.</i>
<b>consignee</b>	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
<b>cordless</b>	A cordless phone. <i>I keep the <b>cordless</b> with me at all times.</i>
<b>delivery</b>	(baseball) the act of throwing a baseball by a pitcher to a batter. <i>Injuries sustained during <b>delivery</b>.</i>
<b>email</b>	Send a message by email. <i>A contract communicated by <b>email</b>.</i>
<b>freight</b>	A charge for transport by freight. <i>Each word was <b>freighted</b> with anger.</i>
<b>intercom</b>	A communication system linking different rooms within a building or ship etc. <i>The pilot s voice comes over the <b>intercom</b>.</i>
<b>mail</b>	Send someone email. <i>You can order by <b>mail</b>.</i>
<b>mailing</b>	The transmission of a letter. <i>The postmark indicates the time of <b>mailing</b>.</i>
<b>message</b>	Send a message to someone especially by email text app or other electronic means. <i>We ll be back after these <b>messages</b>.</i>
<b>pager</b>	A small radio device, activated from a central point, which emits a series of beeps or vibrates to inform the wearer that someone wishes to contact them or that it has received a short text message.
<b>paging</b>	The system of numbering pages. <i>The public address system in the hospital was used for <b>paging</b>.</i>
<b>payee</b>	A person to whom money is paid.
<b>phone</b>	Get or try to get into communication with someone by telephone. <i>I talked to him on the <b>telephone</b>.</i>
<b>radio</b>	The transmission and reception of electromagnetic waves of radio frequency especially those carrying sound messages. <i>A ship to shore <b>radio</b>.</i>

<b>recipient</b>	The semantic role of the animate entity that is passively involved in the happening denoted by the verb in the clause. <i>The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
<b>send</b>	Send a message or letter. <i>It s the spectacle and music that <b>send</b> us not the words.</i>
<b>sender</b>	Someone who transmits a message. <i><b>Senders</b> of unwanted emails.</i>
<b>shipment</b>	The action of shipping goods. <i>The <b>shipment</b> arrived at Liverpool.</i>
<b>shipper</b>	Someone who ships goods.
<a href="#"><u>telephone</u></a>	An instrument used as part of a telephone system typically a single unit including a handset with a transmitting microphone and a set of numbered buttons by which a connection can be made to another such instrument. <i>A <b>telephone</b> call.</i>
<b>television</b>	An electronic device that receives television signals and displays them on a screen. <i>The days before <b>television</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>transmit</u></a>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Knowledge is <b>transmitted</b> from teacher to pupil.</i>
<b>wireless</b>	Having no wires. <i><b>Wireless</b> broadband.</i>
