- Set that receives radio or tv signals.
- A piece of radio or television apparatus that detects broadcast signals and converts them into visible or audible form.
- A person who gets or accepts something that has been sent or given to them.
- (law) a person (usually appointed by a court of law) who liquidates assets or preserves them for the benefit of affected parties.
- A person who buys or accepts goods known to be stolen.
- (in tennis and similar games) the player to whom the ball is served to begin play.
- A person who receives something.
- Earphone that converts electrical signals into sounds.
