<b>acceptance</b>	A draft or bill of exchange that is accepted by being signed. <i>You must wait for <b>acceptance</b> into the village.</i>

<b>acquisition</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The <b>acquisition</b> of self control.</i>
<a href="#">admissible</a>	Deserving to be admitted. <i>The tape recording was <b>admissible</b> as evidence.</i>
<a href="#">admit</a>	Declare to be true or admit the existence or reality or truth of. <i>After searching for an hour she finally had to <b>admit</b> defeat.</i>
<b>admittedly</b>	As acknowledged. <i><b>Admittedly</b> the salary was not wonderful.</i>
<b>adoption</b>	The action or fact of choosing to take up, follow, or use something. <i>Private <b>adoptions</b> are illegal in Britain.</i>
<a href="#">agree</a>	Show grammatical agreement. <i>She s eaten something that didn t <b>agree</b> with her.</i>
<a href="#">agreed</a>	Discussed or negotiated and then accepted by all parties. <i><b>Agreed</b> in their distrust of authority.</i>
<b>annuitant</b>	The recipient of an annuity.

<b>compensation</b>	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>The <b>compensation</b> of victims.</i>
<b>concede</b>	Be willing to concede. <i>In 475 the emperor <b>conceded</b> the Auvergne to Euric.</i>
<b>confess</b>	Of a priest listen to the confession of. <i>I must <b>confess</b> that I half believed you.</i>
<b>consent</b>	Permission to do something. <i>He <b>consented</b> to a search by a detective.</i>
<b>derive</b>	Obtain. <i>They <b>derived</b> great comfort from this assurance.</i>
<b>earn</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>Through the years she has <b>earned</b> affection and esteem.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>You ll <b>get</b> used to it.</i>
<b>grantor</b>	A person or institution that makes a grant or conveyance. <i>Conveyed from <b>grantor</b> to grantee.</i>
<b>incur</b>	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. <i>People who smoke <b>incur</b> a great danger to their health.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Come into possession of. <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to <b>obtain</b>.</i>
<b>permission</b>	An official document giving authorization. <i>They had entered the country without <b>permission</b>.</i>
<b>realization</b>	Coming to understand something clearly and distinctly. <i>He did not live to see the <b>realization</b> of his dream.</i>
<b>receptiveness</b>	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas). <i>He was testing the government s <b>receptiveness</b> to reform.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>A <b>recipient</b> country.</i>
<b>resignedly</b>	With resignation and acceptance; in a resigned manner.
<b>take</b>	Get into one s hands take physically. <i>She <b>takes</b> Route 1 to Newark.</i>
