accede	Take on duties or office. <i>He acceded to the post of director in September.</i>
accept	Make use of or accept for some purpose. <i>What if Elizabeth accepted Darcy the first time.</i>
acceptance	A draft or bill of exchange that is accepted by being signed. <i>You must wait for acceptance into the village.</i>
accepting	Tolerating without protest. <i>The atmosphere was judged to be more supporting and accepting.</i>
acknowledge	Express obligation, thanks, or gratitude for. <i>It is important to acknowledge the work of others in one s own writing.</i>
acquire	Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes). <i>You must acquire the rudiments of Greek.</i>
acquisition	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The acquisition of self control.</i>
admissible	Deserving to be admitted. <i>The tape recording was admissible as evidence.</i>
admit	Declare to be true or admit the existence or reality or truth of. <i>After searching for an hour she finally had to admit defeat.</i>
admittedly	As acknowledged. <i>Admittedly the salary was not wonderful.</i>
adoption	The action or fact of choosing to take up, follow, or use something. <i>Private adoptions are illegal in Britain.</i>
agree	Show grammatical agreement. <i>She s eaten something that didn t agree with her.</i>
agreed	Discussed or negotiated and then accepted by all parties. <i>Agreed in their distrust of authority.</i>
annuitant	The recipient of an annuity.

compensation	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>The compensation of victims.</i>
concede	Be willing to concede. <i>In 475 the emperor conceded the Auvergne to Euric.</i>
confess	Of a priest listen to the confession of. <i>I must confess that I half believed you.</i>
consent	Permission to do something. <i>He consented to a search by a detective.</i>
derive	Obtain. <i>They derived great comfort from this assurance.</i>
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>Through the years she has earned affection and esteem.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>You ll get used to it.</i>
grantor	A person or institution that makes a grant or conveyance. <i>Conveyed from grantor to grantee.</i>
incur	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. <i>People who smoke incur a great danger to their health.</i>
obtain	Come into possession of. <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to obtain.</i>
permission	An official document giving authorization. <i>They had entered the country without permission.</i>
realization	Coming to understand something clearly and distinctly. <i>He did not live to see the realization of his dream.</i>
receptiveness	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas). <i>He was testing the government s receptiveness to reform.</i>
recipient	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>A recipient country.</i>
resignedly	With resignation and acceptance; in a resigned manner.
take	Get into one s hands take physically. <i>She takes Route 1 to Newark.</i>
