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## Associations of "Recidivism" (30 Words)

<b>all</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>All parties are welcome.</i>
<b>always</b>	Throughout a long period of the past. <i>The sun <b>always</b> rises in the east.</i>
<b><u>amplitude</u></b>	The angular distance of a celestial object from the true east or west point of the horizon at rising or setting. <i>The <b>amplitude</b> of alpha rhythms.</i>
<b><u>dabble</u></b>	Dip a foot or hand briefly into a liquid. <i>She <b>dabbles</b> in astronomy.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>They felt better than <b>ever</b> before.</i>
<b><u>frequency</u></b>	The ratio of the number of observations in a statistical category to the total number of observations. <i>A coding sequence to ensure that everyone changes <b>frequency</b> in the correct manner.</i>
<b><u>frequent</u></b>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. <i>A <b>frequent</b> or common error is using the transitive verb lay for the intransitive lie.</i>
<b><u>frequently</u></b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>They go abroad <b>frequently</b>.</i>
<b><u>incidence</u></b>	The intersection of a line, or something moving in a straight line, such as a beam of light, with a surface. <i>He measured the angle of <b>incidence</b> of the reflected light.</i>
<b>infrequently</b>	Not often; rarely. <i>He cooks but only <b>infrequently</b>.</i>
<b>intermittently</b>	In an intermittent manner. <i>He has worked <b>intermittently</b> in a variety of jobs.</i>

<b><u>invariably</u></b>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b>modulated</b>	Changed or adjusted in pitch, tone, or volume.
<b>occasional</b>	Recurring or reappearing from time to time. <i>An <b>occasional</b> table.</i>
<b><u>occasionally</u></b>	Now and then or here and there. <i>He was arrogant and <b>occasionally</b> callous.</i>
<b>offender</b>	A person who commits an illegal act. <i>You can't get away from sex these days and the TV is the worst <b>offender</b>.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>We <b>often</b> met over a cup of coffee.</i>
<b>often</b>	In many cases or instances. <i>He <b>often</b> goes for long walks by himself.</i>
<b>oftentimes</b>	Frequently; many times. <i>I would <b>oftentimes</b> go there.</i>
<b><u>proportional</u></b>	One of the quantities in a mathematical proportion. <i>The punishment ought to be <b>proportional</b> to the crime.</i>
<b><u>quite</u></b>	To the utmost or most absolute extent or degree; absolutely; completely. <i><b>Quite</b> tasty.</i>
<b><u>rare</u></b>	(of an event, situation, or condition) not occurring very often. <i>Total eclipses are <b>rare</b> events.</i>
<b><u>rarely</u></b>	To an unusual degree; exceptionally. <i>We <b>rarely</b> met.</i>
<b>rareness</b>	Noteworthy scarcity.
<b>rife</b>	Excessively abundant. <i>The streets were <b>rife</b> with rumour and fear.</i>
<b><u>sometimes</u></b>	Occasionally, rather than all of the time. <i><b>Sometimes</b> I want to do things on my own.</i>
<b><u>sparse</u></b>	Thinly dispersed or scattered. <i>Areas of <b>sparse</b> population.</i>
<b>sporadically</b>	Occasionally or at irregular intervals. <i>The comedy is only <b>sporadically</b> funny.</i>
<b>successively</b>	Immediately one after another. <i>Three letters of <b>successively</b> decreasing length.</i>
<b>usually</b>	Under normal conditions; generally. <i>Heat resistant paints are <b>usually</b> black or aluminium coloured.</i>
