- *Something which is likely to lead to a particular outcome.*

- formula** A formulation.

- means of achieving** How a result is obtained or an end is achieved.
- means of ensuring** Considerable capital (wealth or income).
- way of achieving** The condition of things generally.
- way of ensuring** The condition of things generally.



Usage Examples of "Recipe" as a noun

- *A traditional Yorkshire recipe.*
- *It would be useless to enumerate all the drugs and recipes for their application which have been tried.*
- *Sky-high interest rates are a recipe for disaster.*

- bake** A social gathering at which baked food of a specified kind is eaten.

broth	A thin soup of meat or fish or vegetable stock. <i>In vitro cultures were established in MG3 broth.</i>
cake	(of a thick or sticky substance that hardens when dry) cover and become encrusted on (the surface of an object). <i>A fruit cake.</i>
chef	Work as a chef. <i>He cheffed on a yacht in the Riviera for two years.</i>
cook	Someone who cooks food. <i>I told you I could cook.</i>
cookery	The practice or skill of preparing and cooking food. <i>Italian regional cookery.</i>
cooking	Suitable for or used in cooking. <i>He developed an interest in cooking.</i>
crispy	(of food) having a firm, dry, and brittle surface or texture. <i>Crispy fried bacon.</i>
crust	Form a crust or form into a crust. <i>A kindly old woman might give her a crust.</i>
flour	Cover with flour. <i>Flour fish or meat before frying it.</i>
fried	Under the influence of alcohol or drugs. <i>A breakfast of fried eggs and bacon.</i>
grill	Cook food using a grill. <i>A grill pan.</i>
johnnycake	Maize flour bread typically baked or fried on a griddle.
lasagna	Baked dish of layers of lasagna pasta with sauce and cheese and meat or vegetables.
noodle	Informal terms for a human head. <i>Spicy Sichuan noodles.</i>
oven	An enclosed compartment, usually part of a cooker, for cooking and heating food. <i>Bake the dish in a preheated oven.</i>
pan	Wash gravel in a pan to separate out gold. <i>The camera panned across the room.</i>
pasta	A dish that contains pasta as its main ingredient.

pizza	A dish of Italian origin, consisting of a flat round base of dough baked with a topping of tomatoes and cheese, typically with added meat, fish, or vegetables. <i>A cheese and tomato pizza.</i>
roast	Of food having been roasted. <i>This is the roast most likely to be used in espresso.</i>
<u>sauce</u>	Provide a sauce for something season with a sauce. <i>Tomato sauce.</i>
smoked	(of glass) treated in such a way as to darken it. <i>A plate of smoked salmon.</i>
soup	Any composition having a consistency suggestive of soup. <i>We had to soup up the show for the new venue.</i>
spaghetti	Spaghetti served with a tomato sauce.
stew	Food prepared by stewing especially meat or fish with vegetables. <i>Beef stewed in wine.</i>
