- aggressive** Tending to spread quickly.  
*We needed more growth to pursue our **aggressive** acquisition strategy.*
- antagonistic** Incapable of harmonious association.  
*His **antagonistic** brusqueness.*
- antisocial** Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder.  
*Criminal behavior or conduct that violates the rights of other individuals is **antisocial**.*
- brawl** A rough or noisy fight or quarrel.  
*He d got into a drunken **brawl** in a bar.*
- careless** (usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration.  
*Forgotten by some **careless** person.*
- combative** Having or showing a ready disposition to fight.  
*He made some enemies with his **combative** style.*

<b><u>ferocious</u></b>	Marked by extreme and violent energy. <i>A <b>ferocious</b> headache.</i>
<b><u>ferocity</u></b>	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>She hated him with a <b>ferocity</b> that astonished her.</i>
<b>foolhardy</b>	Recklessly bold or rash. <i><b>Foolhardy</b> enough to try to seize the gun from the hijacker.</i>
<b>foolish</b>	Lacking good sense or judgement; unwise. <i>A <b>foolish</b> decision.</i>
<b>furious</b>	Extremely angry. <i>He drove at a <b>furious</b> speed.</i>
<b>heedless</b>	Characterized by careless unconcern- Edith Wharton. <i>Elaine she shouted <b>heedless</b> of attracting unwanted attention.</i>
<b><u>hostile</u></b>	(of a takeover bid) opposed by the company to be bought. <i><b>Hostile</b> tender offer.</i>
<b>inadvertent</b>	Not resulting from or achieved through deliberate planning. <i>An <b>inadvertent</b> administrative error occurred that resulted in an overpayment.</i>
<b>inimical</b>	Unfriendly; hostile. <i>The policy was <b>inimical</b> to Britain's real interests.</i>
<b><u>militant</u></b>	A militant reformer. <i><b>Militant</b> in fighting for better wages for workers.</i>
<b><u>oblivious</u></b>	Failing to keep in mind. <i><b>Oblivious</b> old age.</i>
<b><u>psychopath</u></b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
<b>quarrelsome</b>	Given to quarreling. <i>A moody <b>quarrelsome</b> man.</i>
<b><u>rampage</u></b>	Violently angry and destructive behavior. <i>Several thousand demonstrators <b>rampaged</b> through the city.</i>
<b>rash</b>	Imprudently incurring risk- George Meredith. <i>Do something <b>rash</b> that he will forever repent.</i>
<b>rashly</b>	In a hasty and foolhardy manner. <i>He <b>rashly</b> promised crime would fall sharply by September.</i>

- regardless** Without due thought or consideration.  
*He carried on **regardless** of the difficulties.*
- sociopath** Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.
- tempestuous** Very stormy.  
*He had a reckless and **tempestuous** streak.*
- unmindful** Lacking conscious awareness of.  
*Not **unmindful** of the heavy responsibility.*
- unwary** Not alert to danger or deception- O.J.Campbell.  
*Accidents can happen to the **unwary** traveller.*
- violent** Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid.  
*A **violent** clash of colors.*
- wanton** Growing profusely; luxuriant.  
***Wanton** one s money away.*
