<b>aggressive</b>	Tending to spread quickly. <i>We needed more growth to pursue our <b>aggressive</b> acquisition strategy.</i>
<b>antagonistic</b>	Incapable of harmonious association. <i>His <b>antagonistic</b> brusqueness.</i>
<b>antisocial</b>	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>Criminal behavior or conduct that violates the rights of other individuals is <b>antisocial</b>.</i>
<b>brawl</b>	A rough or noisy fight or quarrel. <i>He d got into a drunken <b>brawl</b> in a bar.</i>
<b><u>careless</u></b>	(usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. <i>Forgotten by some <b>careless</b> person.</i>
<b>combative</b>	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. <i>He made some enemies with his <b>combative</b> style.</i>

<b><u>ferocious</u></b>	Marked by extreme and violent energy. A <b>ferocious</b> headache.
<b><u>ferocity</u></b>	The property of being wild or turbulent. She hated him with a <b>ferocity</b> that astonished her.
<b>foolhardy</b>	Recklessly bold or rash. <b>Foolhardy</b> enough to try to seize the gun from the hijacker.
<b>foolish</b>	Lacking good sense or judgement; unwise. A <b>foolish</b> decision.
<b>furious</b>	Extremely angry. He drove at a <b>furious</b> speed.
<b>heedless</b>	Characterized by careless unconcern- Edith Wharton. Elaine she shouted <b>heedless</b> of attracting unwanted attention.
<b><u>hostile</u></b>	(of a takeover bid) opposed by the company to be bought. <b>Hostile</b> tender offer.
<b>inadvertent</b>	Not resulting from or achieved through deliberate planning. An <b>inadvertent</b> administrative error occurred that resulted in an overpayment.
<b>inimical</b>	Unfriendly; hostile. The policy was <b>inimical</b> to Britain's real interests.
<b><u>militant</u></b>	A militant reformer. <b>Militant</b> in fighting for better wages for workers.
<b><u>oblivious</u></b>	Failing to keep in mind. <b>Oblivious</b> old age.
<b><u>psychopath</u></b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.
<b>quarrelsome</b>	Given to quarreling. A moody <b>quarrelsome</b> man.
<b><u>rampage</u></b>	Violently angry and destructive behavior. Several thousand demonstrators <b>rampaged</b> through the city.
<b>rash</b>	Imprudently incurring risk- George Meredith. Do something <b>rash</b> that he will forever repent.
<b>rashly</b>	In a hasty and foolhardy manner. He <b>rashly</b> promised crime would fall sharply by September.

<b><u>regardless</u></b>	Without due thought or consideration. <i>He carried on <b>regardless</b> of the difficulties.</i>
<b><u>sociopath</u></b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.
<b>tempestuous</b>	Very stormy. <i>He had a reckless and <b>tempestuous</b> streak.</i>
<b>unmindful</b>	Lacking conscious awareness of. <i>Not <b>unmindful</b> of the heavy responsibility.</i>
<b>unwary</b>	Not alert to danger or deception- O.J.Campbell. <i>Accidents can happen to the <b>unwary</b> traveller.</i>
<b>violent</b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>A <b>violent</b> clash of colors.</i>
<b><u>wanton</u></b>	Growing profusely; luxuriant. <i><b>Wanton</b> one s money away.</i>
