- *Easily perceived; easy to become aware of.*
- *Able to be recognized or identified from previous encounters or knowledge.*
- *Capable of being recognized.*



Synonyms of "Recognizable" as an adjective (11 Words)

appreciable	Large or important enough to be noticed. <i>Pupils may have to travel appreciable distances.</i>
detectable	Able to be discovered or identified. <i>An easily detectable and treatable disorder.</i>
discernible	Perceptible by the senses or intellect. <i>A discernible change in attitude.</i>
distinguishable	Clear enough to be discerned or perceived. <i>A project distinguishable into four stages of progress.</i>
identifiable	Capable of being identified. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>
noticeable	Undesirably noticeable. <i>The church is noticeable for the fresco above the door.</i>
observable	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>An observable change in behavior.</i>
perceivable	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i>Perceivable through the mist.</i>
perceptible	Easily seen or detected. <i>A perceptible limp.</i>
placeable	Capable of being recognized.
recognisable	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of.

Usage Examples of "Recognizable" as an adjective

- *His car was instantly recognizable.*
- *There was no recognizable photograph of him.*
- *This situation produces recognizable stress symptoms.*

Associations of "Recognizable" (30 Words)

appreciable	Enough to be estimated or measured. <i>Appreciable amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.</i>
apprehensible	Capable of being understood or perceived. <i>A bat whirred apprehensible only from the displacement of air.</i>
classifiable	Capable of being classified.

clearly	In a clear manner; with clarity. <i>Could be seen clearly under the microscope.</i>
comprehensible	Capable of being comprehended or understood. <i>Clear and comprehensible English.</i>
detectable	Able to be discovered or identified. <i>There is a detectable note of bitterness when he talks of his father.</i>
discernible	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Things happen in the earth and sky with no discernible cause.</i>
<u>distinctive</u>	Characteristic of one person or thing, and so serving to distinguish it from others. <i>Juniper berries give gin its distinctive flavour.</i>
distinctly	To a distinct degree. <i>Reading each word slowly and distinctly.</i>
<u>distinguish</u>	Make oneself worthy of respect by one's behaviour or achievements. <i>His modesty distinguishes him from his peers.</i>
easily	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>A mistake that could easily have ended in disaster.</i>
<u>evident</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>She ate the biscuits with evident enjoyment.</i>
identifiable	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>
intelligible	Able to be understood; comprehensible. <i>A barely intelligible reply.</i>
know	Be cognizant or aware of a fact or a specific piece of information possess knowledge or information about. <i>I know that the President lied to the people.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A scar marked face.</i>
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable for its vivid historical background.</i>
observable	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>Observable differences.</i>
<u>palpable</u>	Able to be touched or felt. <i>Felt sudden anger in a palpable wave.</i>
perceivable	Capable of being apprehended or understood. <i>Perceivable through the mist.</i>

<u>perceive</u>	To become aware of through the senses. <i>His mouth fell open as he perceived the truth.</i>
perceptible	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A perceptible decline in public confidence.</i>
plain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>Donations can be put in a plain envelope.</i>
realize	Convert into cash; of goods and property. <i>The drawings are expected to realize 500 000.</i>
recognize	Grant credentials to. <i>The best student was recognized by the Dean.</i>
tangibility	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
telescopic	Capable of discerning distant objects. <i>A telescopic eye.</i>
understandable	To be expected; natural, reasonable, or forgivable. <i>Such fears are understandable.</i>
<u>visible</u>	Visible imports or exports. <i>A visible improvement.</i>
visibly	In a visible manner. <i>He was visibly irritated at the way he had been undermined.</i>
