observation	The act of making and recording a measurement. <i>His powers of observation</i> .
preliminary survey	Something that serves as a preceding event or introduces what follows.



probe	An investigation conducted using a flexible surgical instrument to explore an injury or a body cavity. A probe into city hall corruption.
reconnaissance mission	The act of reconnoitring (especially to gain information about an enemy or potential enemy.
<u>scan</u>	The act of scanning systematic examination of a prescribed region. A quick scan of the sports page.
scrutiny	Critical observation or examination. Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny .
<u>survey</u>	An act of surveying an area of land. The flight involved a detailed aerial survey of military bases.

police	The force of policemen and officers. There are fewer women police than men.
poll	Vote in an election at a polling station. The poll s have only just closed.
pollster	Someone who conducts surveys of public opinion. A pollster conducts public opinion polls.
reconnoiter	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
reexamine	Look at again; examine again.
review	Hold a review of troops. The Queen review ed her brightly arrayed troops.
sally	A sudden charge out of a besieged place against the enemy; a sortie. <i>The garrison there made a sally against us.</i>
<u>scrutinize</u>	Examine or inspect closely and thoroughly. <i>Customers were warned to</i> scrutinize the small print.
scrutiny	Critical observation or examination. Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny .



sentinel	An indicator of the presence of disease. A wide course had been roped off and sentinel led with police.
sentry	A soldier stationed to keep guard or to control access to a place. Two men stood sentry on the door every evening.
sortie	Come out from a defensive position to make an attack. This latest book is the author s first sortie into non fiction.
<u>spy</u>	Watch, observe, or inquire secretly. <i>He agreed to spy for the West.</i>
surveillance	Close observation of a person or group (usually by the police. <i>He found himself put under surveillance</i> by British military intelligence.
<u>survey</u>	A map plan or detailed description obtained by surveying an area. <i>Her green eyes surveyed him coolly.</i>
<u>terrain</u>	A stretch of land, especially with regard to its physical features. They decided to attack across the rocky terrain .
<u>watch</u>	The officers and crew on duty during a watch. My watch had stopped.
