sortie Come out from a defensive position to make an attack.

This latest book is the author's first **sortie** into non fiction.

Watch, observe, or inquire secretly.

He agreed to **spy** for the West.

surveillance Close observation of a person or group (usually by the police.

He found himself put under **surveillance** by British military intelligence.

A map plan or detailed description obtained by surveying an area.

Her green eyes **survey**ed him coolly.

A stretch of land, especially with regard to its physical features.

They decided to attack across the rocky **terrain**.

watch

The officers and crew on duty during a watch.
