#### Definitions of "Recording" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "recording" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A recorded broadcast or performance.
- A disc or tape on which sounds or visual images have been recorded.
- The act of making a record (especially an audio record.
- A storage device on which information (sounds or images) have been recorded.
- A signal that encodes something (e.g., picture or sound) that has been recorded.
- The action or process of recording sound or a performance for subsequent reproduction or broadcast.

transcription

A book of blank pages with pockets or envelopes; for organizing photographs or stamp collections etc.

His debut **album** was very much influenced by the jazz sound.

(genetics) the organic process whereby the DNA sequence in a gene is copied into mRNA; the process whereby a base sequence of messenger RNA

is synthesized on a template of complementary DNA.

They produced a complete **transcription** of the journals.
