## Recording as a Noun

### Definitions of "Recording" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “recording” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A recorded broadcast or performance.*
- *A disc or tape on which sounds or visual images have been recorded.*
- *The act of making a record (especially an audio record).*
- *A storage device on which information (sounds or images) have been recorded.*
- *A signal that encodes something (e.g., picture or sound) that has been recorded.*
- *The action or process of recording sound or a performance for subsequent reproduction or broadcast.*



## Synonyms of "Recording" as a noun (2 Words)

**album** A book of blank pages with pockets or envelopes; for organizing photographs or stamp collections etc.

*His debut **album** was very much influenced by the jazz sound.*

**transcription** (genetics) the organic process whereby the DNA sequence in a gene is copied into mRNA; the process whereby a base sequence of messenger RNA is synthesized on a template of complementary DNA.

*They produced a complete **transcription** of the journals.*

## Associations of "Recording" (30 Words)

<b>acoustics</b>	The study of the physical properties of sound.
<b>amplifier</b>	A device consisting of an amplifier combined with a loudspeaker and used to increase the volume of the sound produced by electric guitars and other musical instruments.
<b><u>audio</u></b>	The audible part of a transmitted signal. <i>The machine can retrieve and play <b>audio</b> from a CD ROM.</i>
<b>barograph</b>	A recording barometer; automatically records on paper the variations in atmospheric pressure.
<b>bell</b>	In boxing and other sports a bell rung to mark the start or end of a round. <i>At five <b>bells</b> in the forenoon of June 11.</i>
<b>cassette</b>	A sealed plastic unit containing a length of audio tape, videotape, film, etc. wound on a pair of spools, for insertion into a recorder, playback device, or other machine.

<b>commentary</b>	A written explanation or criticism or illustration that is added to a book or other textual material. <i>A live <b>commentary</b> on radio.</i>
<b>dictation</b>	Matter that has been dictated and transcribed; a dictated passage. <i>Passages for <b>dictation</b>.</i>
<b>doorbell</b>	A push button at an outer door that gives a ringing or buzzing signal when pushed. <i>Charlotte rang the <b>doorbell</b>.</i>
<b>dubbing</b>	Material used for the bodies of artificial fishing flies, especially fur or wool on waxed silk.
<b>gramophone</b>	An antique record player; the sound of the vibrating needle is amplified acoustically.
<a href="#"><u>hear</u></a>	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>He did not <b>hear</b> very well.</i>
<b>hoarse</b>	(of a person's voice) sounding rough and harsh, typically as the result of a sore throat or of shouting. <i><b>Hoarse</b> cries.</i>
<b>knell</b>	Proclaim something by or as if by a knell. <i>Emails and text messages are sounding the <b>knell</b> for the written word.</i>
<b>phonic</b>	Pertaining to the phonic method of teaching reading. <i>The devices of poetry foreground <b>phonic</b> elements that are usually ignored in practical speech.</i>
<b>phonograph</b>	An early form of gramophone using cylinders and able to record as well as reproduce sound.
<b>playback</b>	A pre-recorded musical soundtrack mimed to by an actor. <i>We listened to several <b>playbacks</b> in the control room.</i>
<b>record</b>	Produce a programme or a piece or collection of music by recording a performance. <i>He tied the Olympic <b>record</b>.</i>
<b>recorder</b>	A tubular wind instrument with 8 finger holes and a fipple mouthpiece. <i>A <b>recorder</b> of rural life.</i>
<b>sonic</b>	Having or caused by speed approximately equal to that of sound in air at sea level. <i>A <b>sonic</b> wave.</i>
<b>squeaking</b>	Having or making a high-pitched sound such as that made by a mouse or a rusty hinge.
<b>stenographer</b>	A person whose job is to transcribe speech in shorthand. <i>A court <b>stenographer</b>.</i>

<b>studio</b>	A studio flat. <i>The music department provided <b>studios</b> for their students.</i>
<b>subliminal</b>	Below the threshold of conscious perception.
<b>tape</b>	Record on videotape. <i>He took along a dozen <b>tapes</b> to record the interview.</i>
<b>transcription</b>	A sound or television recording (e.g., from a broadcast to a tape recording). <i>They produced a complete <b>transcription</b> of the journals.</i>
<b>transistor</b>	A portable radio using circuits containing transistors rather than valves.
<b>video</b>	Computer science the appearance of text and graphics on a video display. <i>How many programmes have you <b>videoed</b> and never managed to watch.</i>
<b>vocalization</b>	The expression of something in words or sounds. <i>A majority of people who want to sing are not aware of basic breathing and <b>vocalization</b>.</i>
<b>whispering</b>	A light noise, like the noise of silk clothing or leaves blowing in the wind.
