communicate	Convey or transmit (an emotion or feeling) in a non-verbal way. <i>The ability of good teachers to communicate their own enthusiasm.</i>
convey	Go or come after and bring or take back. <i>She conveyed the message to me.</i>
delineate	Show the form or outline of. <i>The law should delineate and prohibit behaviour which is socially abhorrent.</i>
depict	Make a portrait of. <i>Youth is depicted as a time of vitality and good health.</i>

describe	Give a description of. <i>Discreet Italian police described it in a manner typically continental.</i>
give an account of	Consent to engage in sexual intercourse with a man.
<u>impart</u>	Bestow (a quality). <i>Shiitake mushrooms impart a wonderfully woody flavour to the salad.</i>
<u>narrate</u>	Narrate or give a detailed account of. <i>The story is narrated by the heroine.</i>
outline	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>She outlined the case briefly.</i>
<u>paint</u>	Apply a liquid to e g paint the gutters with linseed oil. <i>He painting a painting of the garden.</i>
portray	Portray in words. <i>He chose Trevor Howard to portray Captain Bligh.</i>
present	Give as a present make a gift of. <i>We cannot represent this knowledge to our formal reason.</i>
<u>recite</u>	Recite in elocution. <i>Recite a poem.</i>
rehearse	Supervise (a performer or group) during a rehearsal. <i>He had rehearsed a thousand fine phrases.</i>
<u>relate</u>	Have or establish a relationship to. <i>How are these two observations related.</i>
<u>relay</u>	Control or operate by relay. <i>Please relay the news to the villagers.</i>
<u>repeat</u>	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>Billy repeated his question.</i>
report	Cover an event or subject as a journalist or a reporter. <i>Dozens of incidents of wife beatings are reported daily in this city.</i>
retail	Sell on the retail market. <i>The difficulties in retailing the new products.</i>
set forth	Arrange attractively.
tell	Mark as different. <i>Tell him to go away.</i>
<u>unfold</u>	Develop or come to a promising stage. <i>He unfolded the map and laid it out on the table.</i>

Usage Examples of "Recount" as a verb

- *We had to recount all the votes after an accusation of fraud was made.*
- *He recounts how they often talked of politics.*
- *I recounted the tale to Steve.*

Associations of "Recount" (30 Words)

advisory	An announcement that usually advises or warns the public of some threat. <i>A frost advisory.</i>
aforementioned	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of. <i>Songs from the aforementioned album.</i>
aforesaid	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of.
aloud	Audibly; not silently or in a whisper. <i>Cried aloud for help.</i>
article	The definite or indefinite article. <i>Small household articles.</i>
comment	A written explanation or commentary. <i>She commented on the post with three heart emojis.</i>
commentator	A writer who reports and analyzes events of the day. <i>Commentators noted that the demonstration was part of a wider strategy.</i>
declaim	Speak against in an impassioned manner. <i>An opportunity to declaim against the evils of society.</i>
inquiry	An official investigation. <i>He was one of the State's star witnesses in the murder inquiry.</i>
inspection	Careful examination or scrutiny. <i>We carry out regular safety inspections.</i>
interviewer	A person who interviews someone, especially as a job. <i>She took time to answer questions from radio interviewers.</i>
journal	Write in a journal or diary. <i>While abroad he had kept a journal.</i>
mention	An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. <i>He is still regularly mentioned as a possible secretary of state.</i>
narrate	Narrate or give a detailed account of. <i>The story is narrated by the heroine.</i>

notification	An accusation of crime made by a grand jury on its own initiative. <i>We have yet to receive formal notification of the announcement.</i>
obituary	A notice of a death, especially in a newspaper, typically including a brief biography of the deceased person. <i>An obituary notice.</i>
orate	Talk pompously. <i>Lend me your ears Fred orated.</i>
proofread	Read (written or printed material) and mark any errors. <i>They must revise and proofread their work.</i>
quote	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>Quotes for North Sea Brent were rising.</i>
reading	The action or skill of reading. <i>A poetry reading.</i>
recite	Recite in elocution. <i>The doctor recited the list of possible side effects of the drug.</i>
reiterate	Say something again or a number of times, typically for emphasis or clarity. <i>I just want to forget it all he reiterated.</i>
remark	A written or spoken comment. <i>He remarked that he had some work to finish.</i>
repetition	The repeating of a passage or note. <i>A repetition of his reply to the delegation.</i>
report	Be responsible for reporting the details of as in journalism. <i>All our horses are very gentle and are accustomed to hearing the report of a 22.</i>
reportedly	According to what some say (used to express the speaker's belief that the information given is not necessarily true). <i>He was in El Salvador reportedly on his way to Texas.</i>
restate	State (something) again or differently, especially more clearly or convincingly. <i>He restated his opposition to abortion.</i>
review	Hold a review of troops. <i>She reviews books for the New York Times.</i>
soliloquy	A part of a play involving a soliloquy. <i>Edmund ends the scene as he had begun it with a soliloquy.</i>
tell	Communicate information to someone in spoken or written words. <i>Tell me what is bothering you.</i>
