accustom	Be used to. <i>I accustomed my eyes to the lenses.</i>
adapt	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The policies can be adapted to suit individual needs.</i>
adaptation	The process of change by which an organism or species becomes better suited to its environment. <i>The play is an adaptation of a short novel.</i>
adaption	The process of adapting to something (such as environmental conditions.
adjust	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>A single control adjusts the water flow.</i>
adjustment	A small alteration or movement made to achieve a desired fit, appearance, or result. <i>Only slight adjustments to the boat are necessary.</i>
alter	Make an alteration to. <i>The advent of the automobile may have altered the growth pattern of the city.</i>
amend	Make amendments to. <i>A few things had gone wrong but these had been amended.</i>
attune	Accustom or acclimatize. <i>A society more attuned to consumerism than ideology.</i>
convert	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>Convert holdings into shares.</i>
correct	Socially right or correct. <i>The correct version.</i>
disabuse	Persuade (someone) that an idea or belief is mistaken. <i>He quickly disabused me of my fanciful notions.</i>

<u>edit</u>	A version of written recorded or filmed material made as a result of editing. <i>The footage wasn't good enough to be edited into broadcast form.</i>
emend	Alter (something that is incorrect). <i>The text was emended in the second edition.</i>
emendation	A correction or revision to a text. <i>Here are some suggested emendations.</i>
fit	The particular way in which something especially a garment or component fits. <i>A fit subject for discussion.</i>
fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>Lupins fix gaseous nitrogen in their root nodules.</i>
manually	By hand rather than automatically or electronically. <i>Change channels manually rather than using the remote control.</i>
metamorphose	Change in outward structure or looks. <i>The salesman metamorphosed into an ugly beetle.</i>
<u>mistaken</u>	Wrong in one's opinion or judgement. <i>An unfortunate case of mistaken identity.</i>
modify	Transform (a structure) from its original anatomical form during development or evolution. <i>Please modify this letter to make it more polite.</i>
modulation	Alteration of the amplitude or frequency of an electromagnetic wave or other oscillation in accordance with the variations of a second signal. <i>Modulation of the ray amplitude will result in sound being heard.</i>
ratify	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. <i>Both countries were due to ratify the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
<u>relevant</u>	Closely connected or appropriate to what is being done or considered. <i>The candidate's experience is relevant to the job.</i>
reschedule	Arrange a new scheme of repayments of (a debt). <i>The concert has been rescheduled for September.</i>
retouch	Give retouches to hair. <i>Retouch the roots.</i>
<u>revamp</u>	Give new and improved form, structure, or appearance to. <i>Revamp my old boots.</i>
revisal	The act of rewriting something.

revise

Revise or reorganize especially for the purpose of updating and improving.

*The agency **revised** its procedures in as a result of the fire.*

rightness

The quality or state of being best or most appropriate for a particular situation.

*They argue for the moral **rightness** of overthrowing the leader by force.*
