## Associations of "Referred" (30 Words)

<b>advert</b>	An advertisement.
<b>aforementioned</b>	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of. <i>Works of all the <b>aforementioned</b> authors.</i>
<b>aforesaid</b>	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of.
<b><a href="#">allude</a></b>	Mention without discussing at length. <i>We will <b>allude</b> briefly to the main points.</i>
<b><a href="#">allusion</a></b>	The practice of making allusions. <i>An <b>allusion</b> to Shakespeare.</i>
<b><a href="#">annotate</a></b>	Add explanatory notes to or supply with critical comments. <i>He <b>annotated</b> on what his teacher had written.</i>
<b>annotation</b>	A note by way of explanation or comment added to a text or diagram. <i><b>Annotation</b> of prescribed texts.</i>
<b>ascribe</b>	Regard something as being due to (a cause). <i>He <b>ascribed</b> Jane's short temper to her upset stomach.</i>
<b>citation</b>	A mention of a praiseworthy act in an official report, especially that of a member of the armed forces in wartime. <i>The <b>citation</b> described him as an officer of extreme gallantry.</i>
<b><a href="#">cite</a></b>	Mention as an example. <i>The writ <b>cited</b> only four of the signatories of the petition.</i>
<b>consultation</b>	The act of referring or consulting. <i>They improved standards in <b>consultation</b> with consumer representatives.</i>
<b>declaim</b>	Speak against in an impassioned manner. <i>He <b>declaimed</b> against the wasteful ways of modern society.</i>
<b><a href="#">denote</a></b>	Be a sign or indication of. <i>Her smile <b>denoted</b> that she agreed.</i>

<b><u>descriptive</u></b>	Describing or classifying in an objective and non-judgemental way. <i>The text contains some good <b>descriptive</b> passages.</i>
<b>enunciation</b>	The articulation of speech regarded from the point of view of its intelligibility to the audience.
<b>fact</b>	A piece of information about circumstances that exist or events that have occurred. <i>There was a question of <b>fact</b> as to whether they had received the letter.</i>
<b><u>foregoing</u></b>	Just mentioned or stated; preceding. <i>The <b>foregoing</b> analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
<b><u>imply</u></b>	Suggest that someone is guilty. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b>impute</b>	Ascribe (righteousness, guilt, etc.) to someone by virtue of a similar quality in another. <i>The teacher <b>imputed</b> the student s failure to his nervousness.</i>
<b><u>maxim</u></b>	A short, pithy statement expressing a general truth or rule of conduct. <i>The <b>maxim</b> that actions speak louder than words.</i>
<b>mention</b>	An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. <i>There was no <b>mention</b> of it.</i>
<b>notation</b>	A note or annotation. <i>Algebraic <b>notation</b>.</i>
<b>note</b>	Make a written note of. <i>She <b>noted</b> that someone was following her.</i>
<b><u>observe</u></b>	Observe with care or pay close attention to. <i>A tribunal must <b>observe</b> the principles of natural justice.</i>
<b>ostensive</b>	Denoting a way of defining by direct demonstration, e.g. pointing.
<b>quotation</b>	A formal statement setting out the estimated cost for a particular job or service. <i>Since he lacks originality he must rely on <b>quotation</b>.</i>
<b><u>quote</u></b>	Put quote marks around. <i>A <b>quote</b> from Wordsworth.</i>
<b>reference</b>	The relation between a word or phrase and the object or idea it refers to. <i>Popular works of <b>reference</b>.</i>
<b>remark</b>	Notice or comment. <i>He <b>remarked</b> the man s inflamed eyelids.</i>
<b><u>specify</u></b>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>The agency failed to <b>specify</b> that the workers were not their employees.</i>
