## Associations of "Referring" (30 Words)

<b>advert</b>	An advertisement.
<b>aforementioned</b>	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of. <i>Works of all the <b>aforementioned</b> authors.</i>
<b>aforesaid</b>	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of.
<b><a href="#">allude</a></b>	Mention without discussing at length. <i>He <b>alluded</b> to the problem but did not mention it.</i>
<b><a href="#">allusion</a></b>	The practice of making allusions. <i>The use of <b>allusion</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">annotate</a></b>	Add notes to (a text or diagram) giving explanation or comment. <i>He <b>annotated</b> on what his teacher had written.</i>
<b>annotation</b>	The action of annotating a text or diagram. <i><b>Annotation</b> of prescribed texts.</i>
<b>ascribe</b>	Regard a quality as belonging to. <i>He <b>ascribed</b> Jane s short temper to her upset stomach.</i>
<b>citation</b>	A mention of a praiseworthy act in an official report, especially that of a member of the armed forces in wartime. <i>A Nobel <b>citation</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">cite</a></b>	A short note recognizing a source of information or of a quoted passage. <i>Authors who are highly regarded by their peers tend to be <b>cited</b>.</i>
<b>consultation</b>	A meeting with an expert, such as a medical doctor, in order to seek advice. <i>A <b>consultation</b> of several medical specialists.</i>
<b>declaim</b>	Speak against in an impassioned manner. <i>An opportunity to <b>declaim</b> against the evils of society.</i>
<b><a href="#">denote</a></b>	Be a sign of; indicate. <i>Her smile <b>denoted</b> that she agreed.</i>

<b><u>descriptive</u></b>	Of or relating to an approach to linguistic analysis that aims at the description of a language's forms, structures and usage. <b>Descriptive</b> grammar.
<b>enunciation</b>	The articulation of speech regarded from the point of view of its intelligibility to the audience.
<b>fact</b>	A piece of information about circumstances that exist or events that have occurred. <i>First you must collect all the <b>facts</b> of the case.</i>
<b><u>foregoing</u></b>	The things just mentioned or stated. <i>The <b>foregoing</b> analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
<b><u>imply</u></b>	Express or state indirectly. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b>impute</b>	Attribute or credit to. <i>The crimes <b>imputed</b> to Richard.</i>
<b><u>maxim</u></b>	A saying that is widely accepted on its own merits. <i>The <b>maxim</b> that actions speak louder than words.</i>
<b>mention</b>	Make mention of. <i>The unit was awarded fifteen <b>mentions</b>.</i>
<b>notation</b>	A note or annotation. <i>New terminologies and <b>notations</b>.</i>
<b>note</b>	A written sign representing the pitch and duration of a musical note. <i>She <b>noted</b> everything the teacher said that morning.</i>
<b><u>observe</u></b>	Observe with care or pay close attention to. <i>She <b>observed</b> that all the chairs were already occupied.</i>
<b>ostensive</b>	Denoting a way of defining by direct demonstration, e.g. pointing.
<b>quotation</b>	A statement of the current market price of a security or commodity. <i>The company is being refused a <b>quotation</b> on the New York Stock Exchange.</i>
<b><u>quote</u></b>	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>He <b>quoted</b> the Bible to her.</i>
<b>reference</b>	A publication (or a passage from a publication) that is referred to. <b>Reference</b> to an encyclopedia produced the answer.
<b>remark</b>	Regard with attention; notice. <i>The landscape familiar since childhood was not worthy of <b>remark</b>.</i>
<b><u>specify</u></b>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <b>Specify</b> the parameters.
