<b>discrimination</b>	Recognition and understanding of the difference between one thing and another. <i><b>Discrimination</b> learning.</i>
<b>distillation</b>	The action of purifying a liquid by a process of heating and cooling. <i>The film is a <b>distillation</b> of personal experiences.</i>
<b>editing</b>	Putting something (as a literary work or a legislative bill) into acceptable form.
<b>elaboration</b>	Marked by elaborately complex detail. <i>The concept needs more <b>elaboration</b> than a short essay allows.</i>
<b>elegance</b>	The quality of being graceful and stylish in appearance or manner. <i>The simplicity and <b>elegance</b> of the solution.</i>
<b>enlightenment</b>	A movement in Europe from about 1650 until 1800 that advocated the use of reason and individualism instead of tradition and established doctrine. <i>The key to <b>enlightenment</b> is the way of the Buddha.</i>
<b>filtering</b>	An electrical device that alters the frequency spectrum of signals passing through it.
<b>filtration</b>	The action or process of filtering something. <i>Small particles are difficult to remove without <b>filtration</b>.</i>
<b>finesse</b>	Great subtlety and tact in handling or manipulating people or difficult situations. <i>Orchestral playing of great <b>finesse</b>.</i>
<b>finish</b>	The act of finishing. <i>The winner is the team with the most points at the <b>finish</b>.</i>
<b>honing</b>	A whetstone made of fine gritstone; used for sharpening razors.
<b>improvement</b>	The act of improving something. <i>Their <b>improvements</b> increased the value of the property.</i>
<b>judgement</b>	(law) the determination by a court of competent jurisdiction on matters submitted to it. <i>That is not in my <b>judgement</b> the end of the matter.</i>
<b>nicety</b>	A fine or subtle detail or distinction. <i>She prided herself on her <b>nicety</b> of pronunciation.</i>

<b>nuance</b>	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>Without understanding the finer <b>nuances</b> you can't enjoy the humor.</i>
<b>perfection</b>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>The satiny <b>perfection</b> of her skin.</i>
<b>polish</b>	A preparation used in polishing. <i>His poetry has clarity and <b>polish</b>.</i>
<b>polishing</b>	A preparation used in polishing. <i>Every Sunday he gave his car a good <b>polishing</b>.</i>
<b>processing</b>	Preparing or putting through a prescribed procedure. <i>The <b>processing</b> of ore to obtain minerals.</i>
<b>purification</b>	The removal of contaminants from something. <i><b>Purification</b> through repentance.</i>
<b>rarefaction</b>	The lessening of density of tissue, especially of nervous tissue or bone. <i>Opposed processes such as <b>rarefaction</b> and condensation.</i>
<b>refining</b>	The process of removing impurities (as from oil or metals or sugar etc.)
<b>revision</b>	The action of revising. <i>A <b>revision</b> of the Hegelian concept of history.</i>
<b>sensitivity</b>	Sensitivity to emotional feelings of self and others. <i>A total lack of common decency and <b>sensitivity</b>.</i>
<b>shade</b>	A lampshade. <i>This area will be in <b>shade</b> for much of the day.</i>
<b>sifting</b>	The action of sifting something. <i>The laborious <b>sifting</b> of evidence took its toll.</i>
<b>sophistication</b>	The quality of being sophisticated. <i>The technological <b>sophistication</b> of their products.</i>
<b>straining</b>	Difficulty that causes worry or emotional tension- R.J.Samuelsan.
<b>style</b>	In an invertebrate a small slender pointed appendage a stylet. <i>All the reporters were expected to adopt the <b>style</b> of the newspaper.</i>
<b>subtlety</b>	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>You had to admire the <b>subtlety</b> of the distinctions he drew.</i>
<b>taste</b>	The sensation that results when taste buds in the tongue and throat convey information about the chemical composition of a soluble stimulus. <i>She enjoyed her brief <b>taste</b> of independence.</i>
<b>touching up</b>	The act of putting two things together with no space between them.
<b>treating</b>	An occurrence that causes special pleasure or delight.
<b>treatment</b>	The presentation or discussion of a subject. <i>I'm receiving <b>treatment</b> for an injured shoulder.</i>

<b>elaboration</b>	The process of developing or presenting a theory, policy, or system in further detail. <i>The concept needs more <b>elaboration</b> than a short essay allows.</i>
<b>elegance</b>	The quality of being pleasingly ingenious and simple; neatness. <i>The simplicity and <b>elegance</b> of his invention.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Increase. <i>This will <b>enhance</b> your enjoyment.</i>
<b>enhancement</b>	An improvement that makes something more agreeable. <i>The <b>enhancement</b> of civic amenities.</i>
<b>enrich</b>	Improve or enhance the quality or value of. <i>The oil boom <b>enriched</b> a lot of local people.</i>
