- *A thing that is a consequence of or arises from something else.*
- *(mathematics) a transformation in which the direction of one axis is reversed.*
- *An amount of light, heat, or sound that is reflected by a body or surface.*
- *Serious thought or consideration.*
- *The conceptual operation of inverting a system or event with respect to a plane, each element being transferred perpendicularly through the plane to a point the same distance the other side of it.*
- *An image seen in a mirror or shiny surface.*
- *A calm, lengthy, intent consideration.*
- *A remark expressing careful consideration.*
- *A thing bringing discredit to someone or something.*

- *The image of something as reflected by a mirror (or other reflective material).*
- *A transformation in which the direction of one axis is reversed.*
- *A likeness in which left and right are reversed.*
- *The phenomenon of a propagating wave (light or sound) being thrown back from a surface.*
- *The ability to reflect beams or rays.*
- *An idea about something, especially one that is written down or expressed.*
- *Expression without words.*
- *The throwing back by a body or surface of light, heat, or sound without absorbing it.*

assessment

The classification of someone or something with respect to its worth.
*The **assessment** for repairs outraged the club's membership.*

belief	Any cognitive content held as true. <i>The medieval system of fervent religious belief.</i>
brooding	Sitting on eggs so as to hatch them by the warmth of the body.
casting back	Object formed by a mold.
censure	The state of being excommunicated. <i>Despite episcopal censures the practice continued.</i>
cogitation	A carefully considered thought about something. <i>After much cogitation he rejected the offer.</i>
conclusion	A final settlement. <i>He drew his conclusions quickly.</i>
consideration	A considerate and thoughtful act. <i>Your case needs very careful investigation and consideration.</i>
contemplation	A long and thoughtful observation. <i>He would retire to his room for study or contemplation.</i>
criticism	The analysis and judgement of the merits and faults of a literary or artistic work. <i>He ignored the criticisms of his friends.</i>
deliberation	Discussion of all sides of a question. <i>The commission s deliberations.</i>
demonstration	An act of showing that something exists or is true by giving proof or evidence. <i>Physical demonstrations of affection.</i>
derogation	An exemption from or relaxation of a rule or law. <i>Any derogation of the common law is to be strictly construed.</i>
display	Behavior that makes your feelings public. <i>An aerobic display team.</i>
estimation	A judgement of the worth or character of someone or something. <i>Estimations of protein concentrations.</i>
expression	Expression without words. <i>We have an expression You don t get owt for nowt.</i>
feeling	The emotional side of someone's character; emotional responses or tendencies to respond. <i>He laughed to conceal his true feelings.</i>
idea	A mental impression. <i>It s a good idea to do some research before you go.</i>
image	A mental representation or idea. <i>Her imagination forced images upon her too awful to contemplate.</i>

<u>impression</u>	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>I got the impression that he was sorely disappointed.</i>
imputation	The attribution to a source or cause. <i>The imputation that my success was due to nepotism meant that I was not taken seriously.</i>
indication	A datum about some physical state that is presented to a user by a meter or similar instrument. <i>Indications of strain.</i>
judgement	A decision of a law court or judge. <i>The events of last week are a judgement on us for our sinful ways.</i>
likeness	A portrait or representation. <i>Her likeness to him was astonishing.</i>
<u>manifestation</u>	A symptom of an ailment. <i>The manifestation of anxiety over disease.</i>
meditation	The action or practice of meditating. <i>This is not a mythopoetic meditation on manhood it s a historical study.</i>
mirror image	Polished surface that forms images by reflecting light.
mirroring	A faithful depiction or reflection. <i>The mirroring of their words seems designed to try and heal the divide.</i>
musings	A period of reflection or thought. <i>His musings were interrupted by the sound of the telephone.</i>
observation	A remark expressing careful consideration. <i>Detailed observations were carried out on the students behaviour.</i>
opinion	The beliefs or views of a group or majority of people. <i>My opinion differs from yours.</i>
reflectivity	The ability to reflect beams or rays.
reflexion	The image of something as reflected by a mirror (or other reflective material).
reproach	In the Roman Catholic Church a set of antiphons and responses for Good Friday representing the reproaches of Christ to his people. <i>His elegance is a living reproach to our slovenly habits.</i>
rumination	The action of chewing the cud. <i>Cows slow down their rumination.</i>

<u>shame</u>	A state of dishonor. <i>Ignorance of Latin would be a disgrace and a shame to any public man.</i>
<u>slur</u>	A curved line used to show that a group of two or more notes are to be sung to one syllable or played or sung legato. <i>A racial slur.</i>
source of discredit	A facility where something is available.
study	A thing that is or deserves to be investigated the subject of an individual s study. <i>The third bedroom was used as a study.</i>
thinking	The process of using your mind to consider something carefully. <i>I am wrap d in dismal thinkings.</i>
thought	Careful consideration or attention. <i>He s very much in our thoughts and prayers.</i>
thoughtfulness	Consideration for the needs of other people. <i>His face became strange with thoughtfulness.</i>
throwing back	Casting an object in order to determine an outcome randomly.
view	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>The most desirable feature of the park are the beautiful views.</i>
viewpoint	A place from which something can be viewed. <i>From a purely aesthetic viewpoint I must say that I dislike the design.</i>

indican	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime indicants of disease.</i>
indicate	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>His tone indicated that he didn't hold out much hope.</i>
indication	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>Heavy bleeding is a common indication for hysterectomy.</i>

mirror	Reflect as if in a mirror. <i>The smallest pond at night mirrors the firmament above.</i>
mirrored	Having a surface like a mirror; reflective. <i>Mirrored sunglasses.</i>
<u>reconsider</u>	Consider (something) again, especially for a possible change of decision regarding it. <i>Won't you reconsider your decision.</i>
<u>reflect</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>That is quite a serious accusation which reflects on all 120 members of Parliament.</i>

response	A bid made in answer to one's partner's preceding bid. <i>There is considerable species variation in the stomach's response to alcohol.</i>
<u>self</u>	Self pollinate self fertilize. <i>A button through style with self belt.</i>
signal	Communicate silently and non verbally by signals or signs. <i>Equipment for receiving TV signals.</i>
<u>signify</u>	Make known with a word or signal. <i>Signify your agreement by signing the letter below.</i>
smoothed	Made smooth by ironing.
<u>suggest</u>	Suggest the necessity of an intervention in medicine. <i>I suggest that we wait a day or two.</i>
suggestion	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>It was a suggestion we couldn't refuse.</i>
<u>surface</u>	Provide something especially a road with a particular surface. <i>Surface materials of the moon.</i>
