- *The image of something as reflected by a mirror (or other reflective material).*
- *A calm, lengthy, intent consideration.*
- *A transformation in which the direction of one axis is reversed.*
- *The ability to reflect beams or rays.*
- *A likeness in which left and right are reversed.*
- *(mathematics) a transformation in which the direction of one axis is reversed.*
- *A remark expressing careful consideration.*
- *The phenomenon of a propagating wave (light or sound) being thrown back from a surface.*

- contemplation** The action of looking thoughtfully at something for a long time.  
*The road is too busy for leisurely **contemplation** of the scenery.*
- expression** Expression without words.  
*Tears are an **expression** of grief.*
- manifestation** Expression without words.  
*Some supernatural **manifestations** are regarded as portents of good or evil.*
- mirror image** A faithful depiction or reflection.
- musings** In ancient Greek mythology any of 9 daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne; protector of an art or science.  
*His **musings** were interrupted by the sound of the telephone.*
- observation** The act of noticing or paying attention.  
*His powers of **observation**.*

<b>reflectivity</b>	The fraction of radiant energy that is reflected from a surface.
<b>reflexion</b>	The image of something as reflected by a mirror (or other reflective material).
<b>rumination</b>	A calm, lengthy, intent consideration. <i>Philosophical <b>ruminations</b> about life and humanity.</i>
<b>thoughtfulness</b>	Kind and considerate regard for others. <i>His face became strange with <b>thoughtfulness</b>.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Reflections" as a noun

- *He studied his reflection in the mirror.*
- *The pulse is a reflection of the heart's condition.*



## Associations of "Reflections" (30 Words)

- advice** Information; news.  
*He took my **advice** and put his house up for sale.*
- albedo** The proportion of the incident light or radiation that is reflected by a surface, typically that of a planet or moon.  
*The lunar maria have a lower **albedo** than the surrounding terrain.*
- clue** A slight indication.  
*A long pondered **clue** in a half completed crossword.*
- consideration** Kind and considerate regard for others.  
*He showed no **consideration** for her feelings.*
- contemplation** A long and thoughtful observation.  
*Substantial fitting work is in **contemplation**.*
- demonstration** A show or display; the act of presenting something to sight or view.  
*He confused the enemy with feints and **demonstrations**.*

<b>express</b>	Serve as a means for expressing something. <i>Her <b>express</b> wish.</i>
<b>expression</b>	Expression without words. <i>His manner of <b>expression</b> showed how much he cared.</i>
<b>feedback</b>	The process in which part of the output of a system is returned to its input in order to regulate its further output. <i>Throughout this process we have obtained valuable <b>feedback</b>.</i>
<u><b>image</b></u>	The set of values of the dependent variable for which a function is defined. <i>She s the very <b>image</b> of her mother.</i>
<u><b>imply</b></u>	(of a fact or occurrence) suggest (something) as a logical consequence. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	A number or ratio (a value on a scale of measurement) derived from a series of observed facts; can reveal relative changes as a function of time. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>
<b>indicate</b>	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>The president <b>indicated</b> his willingness to use force against the rebels.</i>
<b>indication</b>	(medicine) a reason to prescribe a drug or perform a procedure. <i>An <b>indication</b> of foul play.</i>
<b>introspect</b>	Reflect on one's own thoughts and feelings. <i>What they don t do is <b>introspect</b> much about the reasons for their plight.</i>
<u><b>manifestation</b></u>	An event, action, or object that clearly shows or embodies something abstract or theoretical. <i>Some supernatural <b>manifestations</b> are regarded as portents of good or evil.</i>
<b>meditation</b>	Continuous and profound contemplation or musing on a subject or series of subjects of a deep or abstruse nature. <i>This is not a mythopoetic <b>meditation</b> on manhood it s a historical study.</i>
<b>mirror</b>	Reflect as if in a mirror. <i>The best <b>mirror</b> is an old friend.</i>
<b>mirrored</b>	Fitted with a mirror or mirrors. <i>The room has wall to wall <b>mirrored</b> wardrobes.</i>
<u><b>reconsider</b></u>	Consider again (a bill) that had been voted upon before, with a view to altering it. <i>Won t you <b>reconsider</b> your decision.</i>
<u><b>reflect</b></u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Schools should <b>reflect</b> cultural differences.</i>

<b>response</b>	A statement (either spoken or written) that is made to reply to a question or request or criticism or accusation. <i>The throttle <b>response</b> from the 1870 cc engine is almost petrol sharp.</i>
<b>self</b>	Relating to of or by or to or from or for the self. <i>Paula seemed to be her usual cheerful <b>self</b>.</i>
<b>signal</b>	Communicate silently and non verbally by signals or signs. <i><b>Signals</b> from the boat suddenly stopped.</i>
<b>signify</b>	Convey or express a meaning. <i><b>Signify</b> your agreement by signing the letter below.</i>
<b>smoothed</b>	Made smooth by ironing.
<b>suggest</b>	Suggest the necessity of an intervention in medicine. <i>A simpler explanation <b>suggested</b> itself to me.</i>
<b>suggestion</b>	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>It was a <b>suggestion</b> we couldn't refuse.</i>
<b>surface</b>	Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground. <i>The earth's <b>surface</b>.</i>
<b>thoughtfulness</b>	The trait of thinking carefully before acting. <i>A man of quiet <b>thoughtfulness</b> and sound judgement.</i>
