<b><u>contemplative</u></b>	Deeply or seriously thoughtful. <i><b>Contemplative</b> knowledge of God.</i>
<b><u>longing</u></b>	Having or showing a yearning desire. <i>Her <b>longing</b> eyes.</i>

<b>regretful</b>	Feeling or expressing regret or sorrow or a sense of loss over something done or undone. <i>He sounded <b>regretful</b> but pointed out that he had committed himself.</i>
<b>ruminative</b>	Deeply or seriously thoughtful. <i>A deeply <b>ruminative</b> mysterious lament.</i>
<b>yearning</b>	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>A <b>yearning</b> hope.</i>

<b>brood</b>	A large family of children. <i>She had <b>brooded</b> over the subject a thousand times.</i>
<b>careful</b>	Anxious to protect (something) from harm or loss; solicitous. <i><b>Careful</b> about one's behavior.</i>
<b>cogitate</b>	Think deeply about something; meditate or reflect. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to <b>cogitate</b>.</i>
<b>consider</b>	Show consideration for take into account. <i>The old man <b>considered</b> his granddaughter thoughtfully.</i>

<b><u>considerate</u></b>	Showing careful thought. <i>Be <b>considerate</b> over your handwriting.</i>
<b>contemplate</b>	Look at thoughtfully; observe deep in thought. <i><b>Contemplate</b> one's navel.</i>
<b><u>contemplative</u></b>	A person devoted to the contemplative life. <i><b>Contemplative</b> knowledge of God.</i>
<b><u>deliberate</u></b>	Fully considered; not impulsive. <i>A conscientious and <b>deliberate</b> worker.</i>
<b><u>gentle</u></b>	Make or become gentle. <i>A <b>gentle</b> embankment.</i>
<b><u>glistening</u></b>	Reflecting light. <i><b>Glistening</b> bodies of swimmers.</i>
<b>glossy</b>	A magazine printed on glossy paper containing many colour photographs and typically devoted to fashion beauty celebrities etc. <i>A <b>glossy</b> TV miniseries.</i>
<b>iridescence</b>	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
<b>lustrous</b>	Having lustre; shining. <i>Set a <b>lustrous</b> example for others to follow.</i>
<b><u>meditate</u></b>	Think deeply about (something). <i>They had suffered severely and they began to <b>meditate</b> retreat.</i>
<b>meditative</b>	Deeply or seriously thoughtful. <i><b>Meditative</b> techniques.</i>
<b>mull</b>	A term used in Scottish names of promontories. <i><b>Mulled</b> cider.</i>
<b><u>muse</u></b>	In ancient Greek mythology any of 9 daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne; protector of an art or science. <i>Yeats <b>muse</b> Maud Gonne.</i>
<b>opalescence</b>	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
<b>pensive</b>	Showing pensive sadness. <i>A <b>pensive</b> mood.</i>
<b><u>polished</u></b>	To trim and smooth. <i>He was <b>polished</b> and charming.</i>
<b><u>ponder</u></b>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>I <b>pondered</b> the question of what clothes to wear for the occasion.</i>

**premeditation** (law) thought and intention to commit a crime well in advance of the crime; goes to show criminal intent.

*The defendant said there was no planning or **premeditation**.*

**preoccupied**

Deeply absorbed in thought.

*She seemed a bit **preoccupied**.*

**reflect**

Be bright by reflecting or casting light.

*Schools should **reflect** cultural differences.*

**ruminare**

Think deeply about something.

*Cows **ruminare**.*

**shiny**

Having a shiny surface or coating.

*Saw the moon like a **shiny** dime on a deep blue velvet carpet.*

**sleek**

Having a smooth, gleaming surface reflecting light.

*A **sleek** black cat.*

**thoughtful**

Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention.

*He was attentive and **thoughtful**.*

**wistful**

Having or showing a feeling of vague or regretful longing.

*A **wistful** smile.*
