- *Show an image of.*
- *Reflect deeply on a subject.*
- *To throw or bend back (from a surface.*
- *Manifest or bring back.*
- *Be bright by reflecting or casting light.*
- *Give evidence of a certain behavior.*



Synonyms of "Reflects" as a verb (13 Words)

- chew over** Chew (food); to bite and grind with the teeth.
- contemplate** Think about.
Contemplate one's navel.
- excogitate** Reflect deeply on a subject.
*All the rubrics forms and functions remained to be **excogitated**.*
- meditate** Think deeply about (something).
*They had suffered severely and they began to **meditate** retreat.*
- mull** Think about (a fact, proposal, or request) deeply and at length.
*I **mulled** over the events of the afternoon.*
- mull over** Reflect deeply on a subject.
- muse** Reflect deeply on a subject.
- ponder** Reflect deeply on a subject.
*I **pondered** the question of what clothes to wear for the occasion.*

- reverberate** Treat, process, heat, melt, or refine in a reverberatory furnace.
*The waves **reverberate** as far away as the end of the building.*
- ruminate** Chew the cuds.
*Goats **ruminated** nonchalantly around them.*
- shine** Make a surface shine.
*His talent **shines**.*
- speculate** Talk over conjecturally, or review in an idle or casual way and with an element of doubt or without sufficient reason to reach a conclusion.
*Philosophers have **speculated** on the question of God for thousands of years.*
- think over** Imagine or visualize.



Usage Examples of "Reflects" as a verb

- *This action reflects his true beliefs.*
- *Her sunglasses reflected his image.*
- *Sound is reflected well in this auditorium.*

- *Drive carefully-the wet road reflects.*
- *His lack of interest in the project reflects badly on him.*
- *The mess in his dorm room reflects on the student.*

<u>anticipatory</u>	Happening, performed, or felt in anticipation of something. <i>An anticipatory flash of excitement.</i>
believe	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. <i>She believes in spirits.</i>
bethink	Consider or ponder something carefully. <i>He bethought himself of the verse from the Book of Proverbs.</i>
<u>brood</u>	Hang over, as of something threatening, dark, or menacing. <i>A brood mare.</i>
cogitate	Consider carefully and deeply; reflect upon; turn over in one's mind. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to cogitate.</i>

consider	Show consideration for take into account. <i>The old man considered his granddaughter thoughtfully.</i>
consideration	Information that should be kept in mind when making a decision. <i>The idea was motivated by political considerations.</i>
contemplate	Look thoughtfully for a long time at. <i>I contemplated leaving school and taking a full time job.</i>
<u>deem</u>	Regard or consider in a specified way. <i>The strike was deemed to be illegal.</i>
<u>deliberate</u>	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>Jurors deliberated the fate of those charged.</i>
<u>echo</u>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>The house echoed with shouts.</i>
<u>intend</u>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>A jigsaw puzzle intended for three year olds.</i>
intentionality	The quality of mental states (e.g. thoughts, beliefs, desires, hopes) which consists in their being directed towards some object or state of affairs.
<u>meditate</u>	Plan mentally; consider. <i>They had suffered severely and they began to meditate retreat.</i>
mirror	Reflect as if in a mirror. <i>His site was mirrored at several colleges around the United States.</i>
mirrored	Like or characteristic of a mirror image. <i>Mirrored sunglasses.</i>
mistakenly	By accident or oversight; accidentally. <i>He mistakenly believed it.</i>
mull	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>The government is mulling an overhaul of outdated insurance laws.</i>
<u>muse</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Yeats muse Maud Gonne.</i>
<u>ponder</u>	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. <i>She sat pondering over her problem.</i>
ponderable	Capable of being weighed or considered. <i>Something ponderable from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
reckon	Judge to be probable. <i>I don t reckon his chances.</i>

<u>reconsider</u>	Consider again; give new consideration to; usually with a view to changing. <i>I beg you to reconsider.</i>
<u>reflective</u>	Providing a reflection; capable of reflecting light or other radiation. <i>The reflective type.</i>
<u>reminisce</u>	Recall the past. <i>They reminisced about their summers abroad.</i>
resonate	Be received or understood. <i>The crystal resonates at 16 MHz.</i>
<u>ruminare</u>	(of a ruminant) chew the cud. <i>Goats ruminated nonchalantly around them.</i>
<u>speculate</u>	To believe especially on uncertain or tentative grounds. <i>My colleagues speculate about my private life.</i>
thoughtfulness	Consideration for the needs of other people. <i>I am touched by your thoughtfulness.</i>
wrongheaded	Obstinately perverse in judgment or opinion. <i>A wrongheaded policy.</i>
