chew over	Chew (food); to bite and grind with the teeth.
contemplate	Think about. Contemplate one s navel.
excogitate	Reflect deeply on a subject. All the rubrics forms and functions remained to be excogitate d.
<u>meditate</u>	Think deeply about (something. They had suffered severely and they began to meditate retreat.
mull	Think about (a fact, proposal, or request) deeply and at length. I mull ed over the events of the afternoon.
mull over	Reflect deeply on a subject.
<u>muse</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject.
<u>ponder</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. I ponder ed the question of what clothes to wear for the occasion.



reverberate	Treat, process, heat, melt, or refine in a reverberatory furnace. The waves reverberate as far away as the end of the building.
<u>ruminate</u>	Chew the cuds. Goats ruminate d nonchalantly around them.
shine	Make a surface shine. His talent shine s.
<u>speculate</u>	Talk over conjecturally, or review in an idle or casual way and with an element of doubt or without sufficient reason to reach a conclusion. <i>Philosophers have speculated on the question of God for thousands of years.</i>
think over	Imagine or visualize.



Usage Examples of "Reflects" as a verb

- This action reflects his true beliefs.
- Her sunglasses reflected his image.
- Sound is reflected well in this auditorium.



- Drive carefully-the wet road reflects.
- *His lack of interest in the project reflects badly on him.*
- The mess in his dorm room reflects on the student.

believe	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. <i>She believes in spirits.</i>
bethink	Consider or ponder something carefully. He bethought himself of the verse from the Book of Proverbs.
<u>brood</u>	Hang over, as of something threatening, dark, or menacing. A brood mare.
cogitate	Consider carefully and deeply; reflect upon; turn over in one's mind. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to cogitate.</i>



consider	Show consideration for take into account. The old man consider ed his granddaughter thoughtfully.
consideration	Information that should be kept in mind when making a decision. The idea was motivated by political consideration s.
contemplate	Look thoughtfully for a long time at. I contemplate d leaving school and taking a full time job.
<u>deem</u>	Regard or consider in a specified way. The strike was deem ed to be illegal.
<u>deliberate</u>	Unhurried and with care and dignity. Jurors deliberate d the fate of those charged.
<u>echo</u>	Ring or echo with sound. The house echo ed with shouts.
<u>intend</u>	Mean or intend to express or convey. A jigsaw puzzle intend ed for three year olds.
intentionality	The quality of mental states (e.g. thoughts, beliefs, desires, hopes) which consists in their being directed towards some object or state of affairs.
<u>meditate</u>	Plan mentally; consider. They had suffered severely and they began to meditate retreat.
mirror	Reflect as if in a mirror. His site was mirror ed at several colleges around the United States.
mirrored	Like or characteristic of a mirror image. <i>Mirrored</i> sunglasses.
mistakenly	By accident or oversight; accidentally. <i>He mistakenly believed it.</i>
mull	Reflect deeply on a subject. The government is mull ing an overhaul of outdated insurance laws.
<u>muse</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. Yeats muse Maud Gonne.
<u>ponder</u>	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. She sat ponder ing over her problem.
ponderable	Capable of being weighed or considered. Something ponderable from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.
reckon	Judge to be probable. I don t reckon his chances.



<u>reconsider</u>	Consider again; give new consideration to; usually with a view to changing. <i>I beg you to reconsider</i> .
<u>reflective</u>	Providing a reflection; capable of reflecting light or other radiation. <i>The reflective type.</i>
<u>reminisce</u>	Recall the past. They reminisce d about their summers abroad.
resonate	Be received or understood. The crystal resonate s at 16 MHz.
<u>ruminate</u>	(of a ruminant) chew the cud. Goats ruminate d nonchalantly around them.
<u>speculate</u>	To believe especially on uncertain or tentative grounds. My colleagues speculate about my private life.
thoughtfulness	Consideration for the needs of other people. I am touched by your thoughtfulness .
wrongheaded	Obstinately perverse in judgment or opinion. A wrongheaded policy.
