# Synonyms of "Reflects" as a verb (13 Words)

chew over	Chew (food); to bite and grind with the teeth.
contemplate	Think about. <b>Contemplate</b> one s navel.
excogitate	Reflect deeply on a subject. All the rubrics forms and functions remained to be <b>excogitate</b> d.
<u>meditate</u>	Think deeply about (something. They had suffered severely and they began to <b>meditate</b> retreat.
mull	Think about (a fact, proposal, or request) deeply and at length. I <b>mull</b> ed over the events of the afternoon.
mull over	Reflect deeply on a subject.
<u>muse</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject.
<u>ponder</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. I <b>ponder</b> ed the question of what clothes to wear for the occasion.



reverberate	Treat, process, heat, melt, or refine in a reverberatory furnace. The waves <b>reverberate</b> as far away as the end of the building.
<u>ruminate</u>	Chew the cuds. Goats <b>ruminate</b> d nonchalantly around them.
shine	Make a surface shine. His talent <b>shine</b> s.
<u>speculate</u>	Talk over conjecturally, or review in an idle or casual way and with an element of doubt or without sufficient reason to reach a conclusion. <i>Philosophers have speculated on the question of God for thousands of years.</i>
think over	Imagine or visualize.



### Usage Examples of "Reflects" as a verb

- This action reflects his true beliefs.
- Her sunglasses reflected his image.
- Sound is reflected well in this auditorium.



- Drive carefully-the wet road reflects.
- *His lack of interest in the project reflects badly on him.*
- The mess in his dorm room reflects on the student.

anticipatory	Happening, performed, or felt in anticipation of something. An <b>anticipatory</b> flash of excitement.
believe	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. <i>She <b>believe</b>s in spirits.</i>
bethink	Consider or ponder something carefully. He bethought himself of the verse from the Book of Proverbs.
<u>brood</u>	Hang over, as of something threatening, dark, or menacing. A <b>brood</b> mare.
cogitate	Consider carefully and deeply; reflect upon; turn over in one's mind. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to <b>cogitate</b>.</i>



consider	Show consideration for take into account. The old man <b>consider</b> ed his granddaughter thoughtfully.
consideration	Information that should be kept in mind when making a decision. The idea was motivated by political <b>consideration</b> s.
contemplate	Look thoughtfully for a long time at. I <b>contemplate</b> d leaving school and taking a full time job.
<u>deem</u>	Regard or consider in a specified way. The strike was <b>deem</b> ed to be illegal.
<u>deliberate</u>	Unhurried and with care and dignity. Jurors <b>deliberate</b> d the fate of those charged.
<u>echo</u>	Ring or echo with sound. The house <b>echo</b> ed with shouts.
<u>intend</u>	Mean or intend to express or convey. A jigsaw puzzle <b>intend</b> ed for three year olds.
intentionality	The quality of mental states (e.g. thoughts, beliefs, desires, hopes) which consists in their being directed towards some object or state of affairs.
<u>meditate</u>	Plan mentally; consider. They had suffered severely and they began to <b>meditate</b> retreat.
mirror	Reflect as if in a mirror. His site was <b>mirror</b> ed at several colleges around the United States.
mirrored	Like or characteristic of a mirror image. <i>Mirrored</i> sunglasses.
mistakenly	By accident or oversight; accidentally. <i>He <b>mistakenly</b> believed it.</i>
mull	Reflect deeply on a subject. The government is <b>mull</b> ing an overhaul of outdated insurance laws.
<u>muse</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. Yeats <b>muse</b> Maud Gonne.
<u>ponder</u>	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. She sat <b>ponder</b> ing over her problem.
ponderable	Capable of being weighed or considered. Something <b>ponderable</b> from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.
reckon	Judge to be probable. I don t <b>reckon</b> his chances.



<u>reconsider</u>	Consider again; give new consideration to; usually with a view to changing. <i>I beg you to <b>reconsider</b></i> .
<u>reflective</u>	Providing a reflection; capable of reflecting light or other radiation. <i>The <b>reflective</b> type.</i>
<u>reminisce</u>	Recall the past. They <b>reminisce</b> d about their summers abroad.
resonate	Be received or understood. The crystal <b>resonate</b> s at 16 MHz.
<u>ruminate</u>	(of a ruminant) chew the cud. Goats <b>ruminate</b> d nonchalantly around them.
<u>speculate</u>	To believe especially on uncertain or tentative grounds. My colleagues <b>speculate</b> about my private life.
thoughtfulness	Consideration for the needs of other people. I am touched by your <b>thoughtfulness</b> .
wrongheaded	Obstinately perverse in judgment or opinion. A <b>wrongheaded</b> policy.
