ingenious	Showing inventiveness and skill. <i>His theory while ingenious is most assuredly incorrect.</i>
innovational	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. A mind so innovational so original.
innovative	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>Innovative</i> designs.
inspired	Of extraordinary quality, as if arising from some external creative impulse. She was an inspired gardener.
<u>inventive</u>	Showing creativity or original thought. Had an inventive turn of mind.
invigorating	Making one feel strong, healthy, and full of energy. <i>The invigorating mountain air.</i>
new	Gratuitously new. This tendency is not new .
<u>novel</u>	Original and of a kind not seen before. The computer produced a completely novel proof of a well known theorem.
<u>original</u>	Being or productive of something fresh and unusual; or being as first made or thought of. The original owner of the house.

rejuvenating	Having the effect of restoring a feeling or quality of youth or vigour. A brisk rejuvenating shower.
