<b>individual</b>	Of or for a particular person. <i><b>Individual</b> tiny flowers.</i>
<b><u>individualistic</u></b>	More interested in individual people than in society as a whole. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely <b>individualistic</b>.</i>
<b>ingenious</b>	Showing inventiveness and skill. <i>His theory while <b>ingenious</b> is most assuredly incorrect.</i>
<b>innovational</b>	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>A mind so <b>innovational</b> so original.</i>
<b>innovative</b>	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i><b>Innovative</b> designs.</i>
<b>inspired</b>	Of extraordinary quality, as if arising from some external creative impulse. <i>She was an <b>inspired</b> gardener.</i>
<b><u>inventive</u></b>	Showing creativity or original thought. <i>Had an <b>inventive</b> turn of mind.</i>
<b><u>invigorating</u></b>	Making one feel strong, healthy, and full of energy. <i>The <b>invigorating</b> mountain air.</i>

<b>rejuvenating</b>	Having the effect of restoring a feeling or quality of youth or vigour. <i>A brisk <b>rejuvenating</b> shower.</i>
