ingenious	Showing inventiveness and skill. <i>His theory while ingenious is most assuredly incorrect.</i>
innovational	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>A mind so innovational so original.</i>
innovative	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>Innovative designs.</i>
inspired	Of extraordinary quality, as if arising from some external creative impulse. <i>She was an inspired gardener.</i>
