- develop** Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development.  
*The country **developed** into a mighty superpower.*
- freshen up** Make (to feel) fresh.
- make over** Institute, enact, or establish.
- overhaul** Travel past.  
*The steering box was recently **overhauled**.*
- rebuild** Build (something) again after it has been damaged or destroyed.  
*We try to help them **rebuild** their lives.*
- recondition** Bring into an improved condition.  
*It was necessary to **recondition** the human mind to accept change.*
- reconstruct** Do over, as of (part of) a house.  
*Later emperors **reconstructed** the army.*

- redevelop** Develop for a second time, in order to improve the contrast, colour, etc., of a negative or print.  
*The technology was **redeveloped** during the crusades.*
- rehabilitate** Help to readapt, as to a former state of health or good repute.  
*With the fall of the government many former dissidents were **rehabilitated**.*
- remodel** Shape (a figure or object) again or differently.  
*The station was **remodelled** and enlarged in 1927.*
- renew** Repeat (a statement).  
*We **renewed** our friendship after a hiatus of twenty years.*
- renovate** Give new life or energy to.  
*A little warm nourishment **renovated** him for a short time.*
- restore** Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken.  
*The government **restored** confidence in the housing market.*
- revamp** Give new and improved form, structure, or appearance to.  
***Revamp** my old boots.*

<b>excision</b>	Surgical removal of a body part or tissue. <i>The <b>excision</b> of the carcinoma.</i>
<b>furtherance</b>	The advancement of some enterprise. <i>The court held that the union's acts were not in <b>furtherance</b> of a trade dispute.</i>
<b>help</b>	Give help or assistance be of service. <i>She <b>helped</b> herself to a biscuit.</i>
<b>improve</b>	Develop or increase in mental capacity by education or experience. <i>I subscribed to two magazines to <b>improve</b> my mind.</i>
<b><u>industrialization</u></b>	The development of industries in a country or region on a wide scale. <i>These developing countries have undergone rapid <b>industrialization</b>.</i>
<b>innovation</b>	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i><b>Innovation</b> is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.</i>
<b>lift</b>	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>We heard inspiring talks which <b>lifted</b> our spirits.</i>
<b><u>modernize</u></b>	Make repairs, renovations, revisions or adjustments to. <i>He <b>modernized</b> the health service.</i>
<b>promote</b>	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They were <b>promoted</b> from the Third Division last season.</i>
<b>protestant</b>	The Protestant churches and denominations collectively.
<b><u>rebuild</u></b>	An instance of rebuilding. <i>The <b>rebuilt</b>s include a number of Delage cars.</i>
<b>reclaim</b>	The action or process of reclaiming or being reclaimed. <i>Allow a week or ten days for <b>reclaiming</b> the bird.</i>
<b><u>reconstruction</u></b>	A thing that has been rebuilt after being damaged or destroyed. <i>Comparison between the original and the <b>reconstruction</b>.</i>

<b>reestablish</b>	Bring back into original existence, use, function, or position. <i><b>Reestablish</b> peace in the region.</i>
<b><u>reform</u></b>	The action or process of reforming an institution or practice. <i><b>Reform</b> a political system.</i>
<b><u>reformation</u></b>	A 16th-century movement for the reform of abuses in the Roman Church ending in the establishment of the Reformed and Protestant Churches. <i>The <b>reformation</b> of the Senate.</i>
<b><u>regenerate</u></b>	Bring, lead, or force to abandon a wrong or evil course of life, conduct, and adopt a right one. <i>Methods were developed to <b>regenerate</b> the cellulose for use as fibres.</i>
<b><u>reinstate</u></b>	Bring back into original existence, use, function, or position. <i>The union threatened strike action if Owen was not <b>reinstated</b>.</i>
<b><u>renew</u></b>	Repeat (a statement). <i>The two <b>renewed</b> their friendship not having seen one another for five years.</i>
<b>renovate</b>	Give new life or energy to. <i>A little warm nourishment <b>renovated</b> him for a short time.</i>
<b>restore</b>	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i>The government will <b>restore</b> land to those who lost it through confiscation.</i>
<b>sophisticate</b>	Make someone or something more sophisticated. <i>A <b>sophisticated</b> design.</i>
<b><u>upgrade</u></b>	To improve what was old or outdated. <i>The company <b>upgraded</b> their personnel.</i>
<b>vivify</b>	Give new life or energy to. <i>His remarks always <b>vivify</b> an otherwise dull story.</i>
