deem	Keep in mind or convey as a conviction or view. <i>The event was deemed a great success.</i>
deliberation	Slow and careful movement or thought. <i>The deliberations of the jury.</i>

imaginable	Capable of being imagined. <i>The most spectacular views imaginable.</i>
<u>infer</u>	Guess correctly; solve by guessing. <i>From these facts we can infer that crime has been increasing.</i>
<u>intend</u>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>This one roomed cottage was intended to accommodate a family.</i>
logically	According to the rules of logic or formal argument. <i>Each room leads logically to the next.</i>
perceptual	Of or relating to the act of perceiving. <i>A patient with perceptual problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<u>ponder</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>She sat pondering over her problem.</i>
ponderable	Capable of being weighed or considered- James Jeans. <i>Something ponderable from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
reckon	Judge to be probable. <i>I don t reckon his chances.</i>
<u>reconsider</u>	Consider again; give new consideration to; usually with a view to changing. <i>They called on the US government to reconsider its policy.</i>
<u>reflect</u>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>The clergy were strictly charged not to reflect on the Catholic religion in their discourses.</i>
<u>see</u>	Go to see for professional or business reasons. <i>I can see what will happen.</i>
think	An act of thinking. <i>I think he is very smart.</i>
thinking	Endowed with the capacity to reason. <i>The selectors have some thinking to do before the match.</i>
thought	A personal belief or judgment that is not founded on proof or certainty. <i>19th century thought.</i>
thoughtfulness	Consideration for the needs of other people. <i>Her generosity and thoughtfulness was unbounded.</i>
view	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>Matisse s view of Collioure.</i>
