<b>cogitate</b>	Use or exercise the mind or one’s power of reason in order to make inferences, decisions, or arrive at a solution or judgments. <i>He stroked his beard and retired to <b>cogitate</b>.</i>
<b>cognitive</b>	Relating to cognition. <i>The <b>cognitive</b> processes involved in reading.</i>
<b>consider</b>	Show consideration for take into account. <i><b>Consider</b> the possibility of moving.</i>
<b>consideration</b>	A payment or reward. <i>Another <b>consideration</b> is the time it would take.</i>
<b>contemplate</b>	Think deeply and at length. <i>I <b>contemplated</b> leaving school and taking a full time job.</i>
<a href="#">deem</a>	Keep in mind or convey as a conviction or view. <i>The event was <b>deemed</b> a great success.</i>
<a href="#">deliberation</a>	Slow and careful movement or thought. <i>The <b>deliberations</b> of the jury.</i>

<b>imaginable</b>	Capable of being imagined. <i>The most spectacular views <b>imaginable</b>.</i>
<b><u>infer</u></b>	Guess correctly; solve by guessing. <i>From these facts we can <b>infer</b> that crime has been increasing.</i>
<b><u>intend</u></b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>This one roomed cottage was <b>intended</b> to accommodate a family.</i>
<b>logically</b>	According to the rules of logic or formal argument. <i>Each room leads <b>logically</b> to the next.</i>
<b>perceptual</b>	Of or relating to the act of perceiving. <i>A patient with <b>perceptual</b> problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<b><u>ponder</u></b>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>She sat <b>pondering</b> over her problem.</i>
<b>ponderable</b>	Capable of being weighed or considered- James Jeans. <i>Something <b>ponderable</b> from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
<b>reckon</b>	Judge to be probable. <i>I don t <b>reckon</b> his chances.</i>
<b><u>reconsider</u></b>	Consider again; give new consideration to; usually with a view to changing. <i>They called on the US government to <b>reconsider</b> its policy.</i>
<b><u>reflect</u></b>	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>The clergy were strictly charged not to <b>reflect</b> on the Catholic religion in their discourses.</i>
<b><u>see</u></b>	Go to see for professional or business reasons. <i>I can <b>see</b> what will happen.</i>
<b>think</b>	An act of thinking. <i>I <b>think</b> he is very smart.</i>
<b>thinking</b>	Endowed with the capacity to reason. <i>The selectors have some <b>thinking</b> to do before the match.</i>
<b>thought</b>	A personal belief or judgment that is not founded on proof or certainty. <i>19th century <b>thought</b>.</i>
<b>thoughtfulness</b>	Consideration for the needs of other people. <i>Her generosity and <b>thoughtfulness</b> was unbounded.</i>
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>Matisse s <b>view</b> of Collioure.</i>
