| no matter what | Used to express refusal or denial or disagreement etc or especially to emphasize a negative statement. |
| <u>nonetheless</u> | Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>The rally which the government had declared illegal was nonetheless attended by some 6 000.</i> |
| notwithstanding | Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i>I didn't like it. Notwithstanding, I remained calm.</i> |

- *They were determined to carry on regardless.*

| neglectful | Failing in what duty requires. <i>Neglectful parents.</i> |
| negligent | Characterized by neglect and undue lack of concern. <i>The council had been negligent in its supervision of the children in care.</i> |
| <u>oblivious</u> | Lacking conscious awareness of. <i>Oblivious to the risks she ran.</i> |
| <u>remiss</u> | Failing in what duty requires. <i>Remiss of you not to pay your bills.</i> |
