

nonetheless The rally which the government had declared illegal was


nonetheless attended by some 6 000.

I didn't like it. **Notwithstanding**, I remained calm.








Usage Examples of "Regardless" as an adverb

- The allowance is paid regardless of age or income.
- $\bullet \ \ \textit{He carried on regardless of the difficulties}.$
- They were determined to carry on regardless.

unmindful Not conscious or aware.

Not **unmindful** of the heavy responsibility.

unmolested Not interfered with, disturbed, or harmed.

They allowed him to pass **unmolested**.

untroubled Free from turmoil or worries.
A man untroubled by a guilty conscience.

Feel or cause to feel anxious or troubled about actual or potential

worry problems.
