- The conditions under which a scientific or industrial process occurs.
- A coordinated programme for the promotion or restoration of health; a regimen.
- (medicine) a systematic plan for therapy (often including diet.
- A government, especially an authoritarian one.

command	The power or authority to command. <i>The corporation has just undergone a change in</i> command .



system of government An organized structure for arranging or classifying.		
system	A set of rules used in measurement or classification. You need to get the cholesterol out of your system .	
sovereignty	The authority of a state to govern another state. National sovereignty .	
scheme	An elaborate and systematic plan of action. Police uncovered a scheme to steal paintings worth more than 250 000.	
rule	A rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>The rules of grammar.</i>	
reign	The period during which a monarch is sovereign. He was helpless under the reign of his egotism.	
<u>regimen</u>	A system of government. A regimen of one or two injections per day.	
management	The act of managing something. We would like to thank the management and staff for their continued support.	
leadership	The state or position of being a leader. <i>His leadership inspired the team.</i>	
jurisdiction	The territory or sphere of activity over which the legal authority of a court or other institution extends. <i>Courts having jurisdiction in this district.</i>	
<u>government</u>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>Tyrannical government</i> .	
establishment	A group in a society exercising power and influence over matters of policy, opinion, or taste, and seen as resisting change. <i>The</i> establishment of an independent government.	
<u>dominion</u>	Each of the self-governing territories of the British Commonwealth. Man s attempt to establish dominion over nature.	
direction	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>He had a terrible sense of direction</i> .	
control	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc. Improve your ball control .

authoritarian	An authoritarian person. He had an authoritarian and at times belligerent manner.
<u>autocracy</u>	A system of government by one person with absolute power. The Grand Duchy of Tuscany was an autocracy .
autocratic	Relating to a ruler who has absolute power. <i>Autocratic</i> government.
cavalier	Given to haughty disregard of others. Anne was irritated by his cavalier attitude.
despot	A ruler or other person who holds absolute power, typically one who exercises it in a cruel or oppressive way.
despotic	Ruled by or characteristic of a despot. Moved from a feudal to a despotic order.
despotism	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc. <i>Some nations are democracies others are despotisms.</i>
dictator	A ruler with total power over a country, typically one who has obtained control by force. My boss is a dictator who makes everyone work overtime.
dictatorial	Of or characteristic of a dictator. His mother in law was somewhat dictatorial .
dictatorship	A country governed by a dictator. The effects of forty years of dictatorship .
dominate	Be greater in significance than. The company dominate s the market for operating system software.
domineering	Asserting one's will over another in an arrogant way. How can I do my job with a domineering boss yelling in my ear.
fascism	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism. This is yet another example of health fascism in action.
fascist	Relating to fascism. He went to Spain to fight against the fascist s.
misrule	Govern (a country or state) badly. A country that is recovering from decades of misrule .
monocracy	A system of government by one person only.



<u>monopolize</u>	Get or keep exclusively to oneself. Sophie monopolize d the guest of honour for most of the evening.
oligarchy	A country governed by an oligarchy. The big cities were notoriously in the hands of the oligarchy of local businessmen.
<u>oppressive</u>	(of weather) close and sultry. <i>Oppressive</i> sorrows.
peremptory	Offensively self-assured or given to exercising usually unwarranted power. <i>Peremptory commands.</i>
plutocracy	A state or society governed by the wealthy. No one can accept public policies which turn a democracy into a plutocracy .
proletarian	Relating to the proletariat. A proletarian ideology.
regal	Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i>Her regal</i> bearing.
regent	Acting as regent for a monarch. Prince regent .
<u>sovereign</u>	Possessing supreme or ultimate power. The Emperor became the first Japanese sovereign to visit Britain.
theocracy	The commonwealth of Israel from the time of Moses until the election of Saul as king. It is a society just emerging from theocracy .
totalitarianism	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. Democratic countries were fighting against totalitarianism .
<u>tyrannical</u>	Exercising power in a cruel or arbitrary way. A tyrannical government.
<u>tyranny</u>	Dominance through threat of punishment and violence. The tyranny of the nine to five day.
<u>tyrant</u>	A tyrant flycatcher. Her father was a tyrant and a bully.
