- *A coordinated programme for the promotion or restoration of health; a regimen.*
- *(medicine) a systematic plan for therapy (often including diet).*
- *A government, especially an authoritarian one.*

<b>arrangement</b>	An agreement with someone to do something. <i>The <b>arrangement</b> of the furniture.</i>
<b>authorities</b>	The organization that is the governing authority of a political unit. <i>The matter was referred to higher <b>authorities</b>.</i>
<b>authority</b>	The power or right to give orders, make decisions, and enforce obedience. <i>He hit the ball with <b>authority</b>.</i>
<b>code</b>	A set of rules or principles or laws (especially written ones). <i>Each box had a label with the <b>code</b> SC 90.</i>
<b>command</b>	The power or authority to command. <i>The corporation has just undergone a change in <b>command</b>.</i>

<b>control</b>	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc. <i>Improve your ball <b>control</b>.</i>
<b>direction</b>	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>He had a terrible sense of <b>direction</b>.</i>
<u><b>dominion</b></u>	Each of the self-governing territories of the British Commonwealth. <i>Man s attempt to establish <b>dominion</b> over nature.</i>
<b>establishment</b>	A group in a society exercising power and influence over matters of policy, opinion, or taste, and seen as resisting change. <i>The <b>establishment</b> of an independent government.</i>
<u><b>government</b></u>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>Tyrannical <b>government</b>.</i>
<b>jurisdiction</b>	The territory or sphere of activity over which the legal authority of a court or other institution extends. <i>Courts having <b>jurisdiction</b> in this district.</i>
<b>leadership</b>	The state or position of being a leader. <i>His <b>leadership</b> inspired the team.</i>
<b>management</b>	The act of managing something. <i>We would like to thank the <b>management</b> and staff for their continued support.</i>
<u><b>regimen</b></u>	A system of government. <i>A <b>regimen</b> of one or two injections per day.</i>
<b>reign</b>	The period during which a monarch is sovereign. <i>He was helpless under the <b>reign</b> of his egotism.</i>
<b>rule</b>	A rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>The <b>rules</b> of grammar.</i>
<b>scheme</b>	An elaborate and systematic plan of action. <i>Police uncovered a <b>scheme</b> to steal paintings worth more than 250 000.</i>
<b>sovereignty</b>	The authority of a state to govern another state. <i>National <b>sovereignty</b>.</i>
<b>system</b>	A set of rules used in measurement or classification. <i>You need to get the cholesterol out of your <b>system</b>.</i>
<b>system of government</b>	An organized structure for arranging or classifying.

<b>authoritarian</b>	An authoritarian person. <i>He had an <b>authoritarian</b> and at times belligerent manner.</i>
<b>autocracy</b>	A system of government by one person with absolute power. <i>The Grand Duchy of Tuscany was an <b>autocracy</b>.</i>
<b>autocratic</b>	Relating to a ruler who has absolute power. <i><b>Autocratic</b> government.</i>
<b>cavalier</b>	Given to haughty disregard of others. <i>Anne was irritated by his <b>cavalier</b> attitude.</i>
<b>despot</b>	A ruler or other person who holds absolute power, typically one who exercises it in a cruel or oppressive way.
<b>despotic</b>	Ruled by or characteristic of a despot. <i>Moved from a feudal to a <b>despotic</b> order.</i>
<b>despotism</b>	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc). <i>Some nations are democracies others are <b>despotisms</b>.</i>
<b>dictator</b>	A ruler with total power over a country, typically one who has obtained control by force. <i>My boss is a <b>dictator</b> who makes everyone work overtime.</i>
<b>dictatorial</b>	Of or characteristic of a dictator. <i>His mother in law was somewhat <b>dictatorial</b>.</i>
<b>dictatorship</b>	A country governed by a dictator. <i>The effects of forty years of <b>dictatorship</b>.</i>
<b>dominate</b>	Be greater in significance than. <i>The company <b>dominates</b> the market for operating system software.</i>
<b>domineering</b>	Asserting one's will over another in an arrogant way. <i>How can I do my job with a <b>domineering</b> boss yelling in my ear.</i>
<b>fascism</b>	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health <b>fascism</b> in action.</i>
<b>fascist</b>	Relating to fascism. <i>He went to Spain to fight against the <b>fascists</b>.</i>
<b>misrule</b>	Govern (a country or state) badly. <i>A country that is recovering from decades of <b>misrule</b>.</i>
<b>monocracy</b>	A system of government by one person only.

<b><u>monopolize</u></b>	Get or keep exclusively to oneself. <i>Sophie <b>monopolized</b> the guest of honour for most of the evening.</i>
<b>oligarchy</b>	A country governed by an oligarchy. <i>The big cities were notoriously in the hands of the <b>oligarchy</b> of local businessmen.</i>
<b><u>oppressive</u></b>	(of weather) close and sultry. <b>Oppressive</b> sorrows.
<b>peremptory</b>	Offensively self-assured or given to exercising usually unwarranted power. <b>Peremptory</b> commands.
<b>plutocracy</b>	A state or society governed by the wealthy. <i>No one can accept public policies which turn a democracy into a <b>plutocracy</b>.</i>
<b>proletarian</b>	Relating to the proletariat. <i>A <b>proletarian</b> ideology.</i>
<b>regal</b>	Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i>Her <b>regal</b> bearing.</i>
<b>regent</b>	Acting as regent for a monarch. <i>Prince <b>regent</b>.</i>
<b><u>sovereign</u></b>	Possessing supreme or ultimate power. <i>The Emperor became the first Japanese <b>sovereign</b> to visit Britain.</i>
<b><u>theocracy</u></b>	The commonwealth of Israel from the time of Moses until the election of Saul as king. <i>It is a society just emerging from <b>theocracy</b>.</i>
<b>totalitarianism</b>	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against <b>totalitarianism</b>.</i>
<b><u>tyrannical</u></b>	Exercising power in a cruel or arbitrary way. <i>A <b>tyrannical</b> government.</i>
<b><u>tyranny</u></b>	Dominance through threat of punishment and violence. <i>The <b>tyranny</b> of the nine to five day.</i>
<b><u>tyrant</u></b>	A tyrant flycatcher. <i>Her father was a <b>tyrant</b> and a bully.</i>
