jurisdiction	The territory or sphere of activity over which the legal authority of a court or other institution extends. <i>Courts having jurisdiction in this district.</i>
leadership	The state or position of being a leader. <i>His leadership inspired the team.</i>
management	The act of managing something. <i>We would like to thank the management and staff for their continued support.</i>
<u>regimen</u>	A system of government. <i>A regimen of one or two injections per day.</i>
reign	The period during which a monarch is sovereign. <i>He was helpless under the reign of his egotism.</i>
rule	A rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>The rules of grammar.</i>
scheme	An elaborate and systematic plan of action. <i>Police uncovered a scheme to steal paintings worth more than 250 000.</i>
sovereignty	The authority of a state to govern another state. <i>National sovereignty.</i>
system	A set of rules used in measurement or classification. <i>You need to get the cholesterol out of your system.</i>
system of government	An organized structure for arranging or classifying.

authoritarian	An authoritarian person. <i>He had an authoritarian and at times belligerent manner.</i>
autocracy	A system of government by one person with absolute power. <i>The Grand Duchy of Tuscany was an autocracy.</i>
autocratic	Relating to a ruler who has absolute power. <i>Autocratic government.</i>
cavalier	Given to haughty disregard of others. <i>Anne was irritated by his cavalier attitude.</i>
despot	A ruler or other person who holds absolute power, typically one who exercises it in a cruel or oppressive way.
despotic	Ruled by or characteristic of a despot. <i>Moved from a feudal to a despotic order.</i>
despotism	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc). <i>Some nations are democracies others are despotisms.</i>
dictator	A ruler with total power over a country, typically one who has obtained control by force. <i>My boss is a dictator who makes everyone work overtime.</i>
dictatorial	Of or characteristic of a dictator. <i>His mother in law was somewhat dictatorial.</i>
dictatorship	A country governed by a dictator. <i>The effects of forty years of dictatorship.</i>
dominate	Be greater in significance than. <i>The company dominates the market for operating system software.</i>
domineering	Asserting one's will over another in an arrogant way. <i>How can I do my job with a domineering boss yelling in my ear.</i>
fascism	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health fascism in action.</i>
fascist	Relating to fascism. <i>He went to Spain to fight against the fascists.</i>
misrule	Govern (a country or state) badly. <i>A country that is recovering from decades of misrule.</i>
monocracy	A system of government by one person only.

<u>monopolize</u>	Get or keep exclusively to oneself. <i>Sophie monopolized the guest of honour for most of the evening.</i>
oligarchy	A country governed by an oligarchy. <i>The big cities were notoriously in the hands of the oligarchy of local businessmen.</i>
<u>oppressive</u>	(of weather) close and sultry. Oppressive sorrows.
peremptory	Offensively self-assured or given to exercising usually unwarranted power. Peremptory commands.
plutocracy	A state or society governed by the wealthy. <i>No one can accept public policies which turn a democracy into a plutocracy.</i>
proletarian	Relating to the proletariat. <i>A proletarian ideology.</i>
regal	Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i>Her regal bearing.</i>
regent	Acting as regent for a monarch. <i>Prince regent.</i>
<u>sovereign</u>	Possessing supreme or ultimate power. <i>The Emperor became the first Japanese sovereign to visit Britain.</i>
<u>theocracy</u>	The commonwealth of Israel from the time of Moses until the election of Saul as king. <i>It is a society just emerging from theocracy.</i>
totalitarianism	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against totalitarianism.</i>
<u>tyrannical</u>	Exercising power in a cruel or arbitrary way. <i>A tyrannical government.</i>
<u>tyranny</u>	Dominance through threat of punishment and violence. <i>The tyranny of the nine to five day.</i>
<u>tyrant</u>	A tyrant flycatcher. <i>Her father was a tyrant and a bully.</i>
