- *An area of activity or thought.*
- *A part of the body, especially around or near an organ.*
- *An area, especially part of a country or the world having definable characteristics but not always fixed boundaries.*
- *The extended spatial location of something.*
- *A large indefinite location on the surface of the Earth.*
- *An administrative district of a city or country.*
- *The approximate amount of something (usually used prepositionally as in `in the region of.*
- *The parts of a country outside the capital or chief seat of government.*
- *A knowledge domain that you are interested in or are communicating about.*
- *A part of an animal that has a special function or is supplied by a given artery or nerve.*

department	The territorial and administrative division of some countries (such as France). <i>That s not my department.</i>
<u>district</u>	A region marked off for administrative or other purposes. <i>A district health authority.</i>
division	Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>An infantry division.</i>

domain	The content of a particular field of knowledge. <i>His domain extended into Europe.</i>
<u>expanse</u>	A wide and open space or area as of surface or land or sky. <i>The green expanse of the forest.</i>
<u>field</u>	The force exerted or potentially exerted in a field. <i>A wheat field.</i>
land	The land on which real estate is located. <i>You re living in a fantasy land.</i>
locale	A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it. <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i>
locality	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i>
<u>neighborhood</u>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The price is in the neighborhood of 100.</i>
neighbourhood	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>She lived in a wealthy neighbourhood of Boston.</i>
part	That which concerns a person with regard to a particular role or situation. <i>I was part of the family.</i>
precinct	The police station situated in a precinct. <i>A pedestrian precinct.</i>
<u>province</u>	The whole of a country outside the capital, especially when regarded as lacking in sophistication or culture. <i>I made my way home to the dreary provinces by train.</i>
quarter	The haunches or hindquarters of a horse. <i>It s a quarter til 4.</i>
<u>realm</u>	The domain ruled by a king or queen. <i>An overall Labour majority is not beyond the realms of possibility.</i>
<u>section</u>	A particular district of a town. <i>Sections from the left ventricle showed diseased tissue.</i>
<u>sector</u>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern sector of the North Sea.</i>
stretch	A stretch limo. <i>He did a stretch in the federal penitentiary.</i>

<u>terrain</u>	A piece of ground having specific characteristics or military potential. <i>They were delayed by rough terrain.</i>
<u>territory</u>	An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport. <i>His questions covered a lot of territory.</i>
<u>tract</u>	A system of body parts that together serve some particular purpose. <i>The digestive tract.</i>
zone	A belt or girdle worn round a person's body. <i>A zone of easterly winds.</i>

coastal	Of or near a coast. <i>The Atlantic coastal plain.</i>
district	A region defined for an administrative purpose. <i>A district health authority.</i>
domain	A distinct subset of the internet with addresses sharing a common suffix or under the control of a particular organization or individual. <i>The country's isolation in the domain of sport.</i>
dune	A ridge of sand created by the wind; found in deserts or near lakes and oceans. <i>A sand dune.</i>
foreshore	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
geographical	Relating to geography. <i>The geographical distribution of plants.</i>
gulf	An unbridgeable disparity (as from a failure of understanding). <i>He felt a gulf between himself and his former friends.</i>
island	A zone or area resembling an island. <i>The island of Crete.</i>
isle	An island or peninsula, especially a small one. <i>Crusoe's fabled isle.</i>
islet	A portion of tissue structurally distinct from surrounding tissues.
lagoon	A small freshwater lake near a larger lake or river.
land	Extensive landed property especially in the country retained by the owner for his own use. <i>Measures to reduce logging on federal lands.</i>
littoral	The littoral zone. <i>Irrigated regions of the Mediterranean littoral.</i>
map	Represent an area on a map make a map of. <i>It is not obvious that the subprocesses of language will map on to individual brain areas.</i>
maritime	Relating to or involving ships or shipping or navigation or seamen. <i>Maritime farmers.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i>Municipal offices.</i>
nautical	Relating to or involving ships or shipping or navigation or seamen. <i>Nautical charts.</i>
peninsula	A large mass of land projecting into a body of water.

peninsular	Of or forming or resembling a peninsula. <i>The counties of peninsular Florida.</i>
physiography	The study of physical features of the earth's surface.
province	The territory occupied by one of the constituent administrative districts of a nation. <i>It was his province to take care of himself.</i>
seashore	An area of sandy, stony, or rocky land bordering and level with the sea.
southern	In or characteristic of a region of the United States south of (approximately) the Mason-Dixon line. <i>Southern breezes.</i>
subdivide	Divide (something that has already been divided or that is a separate unit). <i>This apartment cannot be subdivided any further.</i>
underpopulated	Having an insufficient or very small population. <i>The richly endowed but underpopulated Ivory Coast.</i>
zone	Designate a specific area for use or development as a particular zone in planning. <i>I was in the zone completing the first nine holes in one under par.</i>
zoning	The classification of land according to restrictions placed on its use and development. <i>Those opposed to zoning argued that the party's presidential standard bearer could come from any part of the country.</i>
