- *An area of activity or thought.*
- *A part of the body, especially around or near an organ.*
- *An area, especially part of a country or the world having definable characteristics but not always fixed boundaries.*
- *The extended spatial location of something.*
- *A large indefinite location on the surface of the Earth.*
- *An administrative district of a city or country.*
- *The approximate amount of something (usually used prepositionally as in `in the region of.*
- *The parts of a country outside the capital or chief seat of government.*
- *A knowledge domain that you are interested in or are communicating about.*
- *A part of an animal that has a special function or is supplied by a given artery or nerve.*

<b><u>arena</u></b>	A place or scene of activity, debate, or conflict. <i>He has re entered the political <b>arena</b>.</i>
<b>belt</b>	A person who is qualified to wear a belt of a specified colour in judo karate etc. <i>The asteroid <b>belt</b>.</i>
<b>department</b>	The territorial and administrative division of some countries (such as France). <i>That s not my <b>department</b>.</i>
<b><u>district</u></b>	A region marked off for administrative or other purposes. <i>A <b>district</b> health authority.</i>
<b>division</b>	Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>An infantry <b>division</b>.</i>

<b>domain</b>	The content of a particular field of knowledge. <i>His <b>domain</b> extended into Europe.</i>
<b><u>expanse</u></b>	A wide and open space or area as of surface or land or sky. <i>The green <b>expanse</b> of the forest.</i>
<b><u>field</u></b>	The force exerted or potentially exerted in a field. <i>A wheat <b>field</b>.</i>
<b>land</b>	The land on which real estate is located. <i>You re living in a fantasy <b>land</b>.</i>
<b>locale</b>	A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it. <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic <b>locales</b>.</i>
<b>locality</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The rock s size and <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b><u>neighborhood</u></b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The price is in the <b>neighborhood</b> of 100.</i>
<b>neighbourhood</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>She lived in a wealthy <b>neighbourhood</b> of Boston.</i>
<b>part</b>	That which concerns a person with regard to a particular role or situation. <i>I was <b>part</b> of the family.</i>
<b>precinct</b>	The police station situated in a precinct. <i>A pedestrian <b>precinct</b>.</i>
<b><u>province</u></b>	The whole of a country outside the capital, especially when regarded as lacking in sophistication or culture. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	The haunches or hindquarters of a horse. <i>It s a <b>quarter</b> til 4.</i>
<b><u>realm</u></b>	The domain ruled by a king or queen. <i>An overall Labour majority is not beyond the <b>realms</b> of possibility.</i>
<b><u>section</u></b>	A particular district of a town. <i><b>Sections</b> from the left ventricle showed diseased tissue.</i>
<b><u>sector</u></b>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern <b>sector</b> of the North Sea.</i>
<b>stretch</b>	A stretch limo. <i>He did a <b>stretch</b> in the federal penitentiary.</i>



<b><u>terrain</u></b>	A piece of ground having specific characteristics or military potential. <i>They were delayed by rough <b>terrain</b>.</i>
<b><u>territory</u></b>	An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport. <i>His questions covered a lot of <b>territory</b>.</i>
<b><u>tract</u></b>	A system of body parts that together serve some particular purpose. <i>The digestive <b>tract</b>.</i>
<b>zone</b>	A belt or girdle worn round a person's body. <i>A <b>zone</b> of easterly winds.</i>

<b>coastal</b>	Of or near a coast. <i>The Atlantic <b>coastal</b> plain.</i>
<b>district</b>	A region defined for an administrative purpose. <i>A <b>district</b> health authority.</i>
<b>domain</b>	A distinct subset of the internet with addresses sharing a common suffix or under the control of a particular organization or individual. <i>The country's isolation in the <b>domain</b> of sport.</i>
<b>dune</b>	A ridge of sand created by the wind; found in deserts or near lakes and oceans. <i>A sand <b>dune</b>.</i>
<b>foreshore</b>	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
<b>geographical</b>	Relating to geography. <i>The <b>geographical</b> distribution of plants.</i>
<b>gulf</b>	An unbridgeable disparity (as from a failure of understanding). <i>He felt a <b>gulf</b> between himself and his former friends.</i>
<b>island</b>	A zone or area resembling an island. <i>The <b>island</b> of Crete.</i>
<b>isle</b>	An island or peninsula, especially a small one. <i>Crusoe's fabled <b>isle</b>.</i>
<b>islet</b>	A portion of tissue structurally distinct from surrounding tissues.
<b>lagoon</b>	A small freshwater lake near a larger lake or river.
<b>land</b>	Extensive landed property especially in the country retained by the owner for his own use. <i>Measures to reduce logging on federal <b>lands</b>.</i>
<b>littoral</b>	The littoral zone. <i>Irrigated regions of the Mediterranean <b>littoral</b>.</i>
<b>map</b>	Represent an area on a map make a map of. <i>It is not obvious that the subprocesses of language will <b>map</b> on to individual brain areas.</i>
<b>maritime</b>	Relating to or involving ships or shipping or navigation or seamen. <i><b>Maritime</b> farmers.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i><b>Municipal</b> offices.</i>
<b>nautical</b>	Relating to or involving ships or shipping or navigation or seamen. <i><b>Nautical</b> charts.</i>
<b>peninsula</b>	A large mass of land projecting into a body of water.



<b>peninsular</b>	Of or forming or resembling a peninsula. <i>The counties of <b>peninsular</b> Florida.</i>
<b>physiography</b>	The study of physical features of the earth's surface.
<b>province</b>	The territory occupied by one of the constituent administrative districts of a nation. <i>It was his <b>province</b> to take care of himself.</i>
<b>seashore</b>	An area of sandy, stony, or rocky land bordering and level with the sea.
<b>southern</b>	In or characteristic of a region of the United States south of (approximately) the Mason-Dixon line. <i><b>Southern</b> breezes.</i>
<b>subdivide</b>	Divide (something that has already been divided or that is a separate unit). <i>This apartment cannot be <b>subdivided</b> any further.</i>
<b>underpopulated</b>	Having an insufficient or very small population. <i>The richly endowed but <b>underpopulated</b> Ivory Coast.</i>
<b>zone</b>	Designate a specific area for use or development as a particular zone in planning. <i>I was in the <b>zone</b> completing the first nine holes in one under par.</i>
<b>zoning</b>	The classification of land according to restrictions placed on its use and development. <i>Those opposed to <b>zoning</b> argued that the party's presidential standard bearer could come from any part of the country.</i>
