Definitions of "Regions" as a noun

- *The approximate amount of something (usually used prepositionally as in `in the region of.*
- *The extended spatial location of something.*
- *A knowledge domain that you are interested in or are communicating about.*
- *A large indefinite location on the surface of the Earth.*
- *A part of an animal that has a special function or is supplied by a given artery or nerve.*

| <u>neighborhood</u> | An area within a city or town that has some distinctive features (especially one forming a community). <i>He always blames someone else in the immediate neighborhood.</i> |
| part | That which concerns a person with regard to a particular role or situation. <i>She was memorizing a part.</i> |
| <u>realm</u> | A field or domain of activity or interest. <i>The realm of the occult.</i> |

A group of many islands in a large body of water.
*The Indonesian **archipelago**.*

area

The extent or measurement of a surface or piece of land.
*The key **areas** of science.*

bay

A small recess opening off a larger room.
*A boat trip round the **bay**.*

coastal

Of or near a coast.
***Coastal** waters.*

district

A region defined for an administrative purpose.
*The committee **districted** the city into blocks.*

domain

A distinct subset of the internet with addresses sharing a common suffix or under the control of a particular organization or individual.
*The country's isolation in the **domain** of sport.*

| dune | A mound or ridge of sand or other loose sediment formed by the wind, especially on the sea coast or in a desert. <i>A sand dune.</i> |
| foreshore | The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land. |
| geographical | Based on or derived from the physical features of an area. <i>Geographical research.</i> |
| gulf | A deep ravine, chasm, or abyss. <i>The widening gulf between the rich and the poor.</i> |
| island | A zone or area resembling an island. <i>This island nation.</i> |
| isle | An island or peninsula, especially a small one. <i>Crusoe's fabled isle.</i> |
| islet | A portion of tissue structurally distinct from surrounding tissues. |
| lagoon | An artificial pool for the treatment of effluent or to accommodate an overflow from surface drains during heavy rain. |
| land | Extensive landed property especially in the country retained by the owner for his own use. <i>The bird landed on the highest branch.</i> |
| littoral | The littoral zone. <i>Irrigated regions of the Mediterranean littoral.</i> |
| map | Make a map of show or establish the features of details of. <i>A street map.</i> |
| maritime | (of climate) moist and temperate owing to the influence of the sea. <i>Maritime law.</i> |
| municipal | Relating or belonging to or characteristic of a municipality. <i>Municipal offices.</i> |
| nautical | Relating to or involving ships or shipping or navigation or seamen. <i>Nautical charts.</i> |
| peninsula | A piece of land almost surrounded by water or projecting out into a body of water. |
| peninsular | Of or forming or resembling a peninsula. <i>The counties of peninsular Florida.</i> |
| physiography | The study of physical features of the earth's surface. |
| province | A territory outside Italy under a Roman governor. <i>It was his province to take care of himself.</i> |
| seashore | An area of sandy, stony, or rocky land bordering and level with the sea. |

| southern | Situated in or oriented toward the south. <i>Southern cooking.</i> |
| subdivide | Form into subdivisions. <i>The heading was subdivided into eight separate sections.</i> |
| underpopulated | Having a lower population density than normal or desirable. <i>The rocky and underpopulated west coast.</i> |
| zone | Divide into or assign to zones. <i>A pedestrian zone.</i> |
| zoning | Dividing an area into zones or sections reserved for different purposes such as residence and business and manufacturing etc. <i>Those opposed to zoning argued that the party's presidential standard bearer could come from any part of the country.</i> |
