announce	Announce publicly or officially. The President s office announce d that the siege would be lifted.
<u>apologetic</u>	Offering or expressing apology. She was very apologetic about the whole incident.
apologize	Acknowledge faults or shortcomings or failing. <i>He apologized for the many typoes.</i>
confess	Of a priest listen to the confession of. 150 people confess ed faith in Christ.
<u>confession</u>	The religious body or Church sharing a confession of faith. <i>He signed a confession to both the murders.</i>
contrite	Feeling or expressing remorse at the recognition that one has done wrong. <i>A contrite tone.</i>
contrition	(in the Roman Catholic Church) the repentance of past sins during or after confession. <i>To show contrition</i> for his crime he offered to do community service.
deplorable	Bringing or deserving severe rebuke or censure. My finances were in a deplorable state.
forgive	Stop blaming or grant forgiveness. I was willing to forgive all her faults for the sake of our friendship.
pardon	Grant a pardon to. Ford pardon ed Nixon.
penance	Impose a penance on. He had done public penance for those hasty words.
penitence	Remorse for your past conduct. A public display of penitence .



penitent	A person who repents their sins and (in the Christian Church) seeks forgiveness from God. A penitent expression.
penitential	Relating to or expressing penitence or penance. Wrote a penitential letter apologizing for her hasty words.
<u>pity</u>	An unfortunate development. It s a pity you didn t contact us first.
profess	Teach a subject as a professor. Though knowing little of the arts I profess ed he proved a natural adept.
regret	Express with regret. Any inconvenience to readers is regret ted.
regretful	Feeling or expressing regret or sorrow or a sense of loss over something done or undone. <i>Regretful</i> over mistakes she had made.
regrettable	(of conduct or an event) giving rise to regret; undesirable; unwelcome. It s regrettable that she didn t go to college.
<u>remorse</u>	A feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed. They were filled with remorse and shame.
remorseful	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. The defendant was remorseful for what he had done.
repent	View or think of (an action or omission) with deep regret or remorse. Marian came to repent her hasty judgement.
<u>repentance</u>	The action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse. <i>Each person who turns to God in genuine</i> repentance <i>and faith will be saved.</i>
repentant	Feeling or expressing remorse for misdeeds. <i>He is truly repentant for his incredible naivety and stupidity.</i>
rue	Bitterly regret (something one has done or allowed to happen) and wish it undone. With rue my heart is laden.
<u>rueful</u>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. She gave a rueful grin.
sceptic	A person who doubts the truth of Christianity and other religions; an atheist.
<u>sinner</u>	A person who sins (without repenting. God forgives repentant sinner s.
<u>sorrow</u>	An event or circumstance that causes sorrow. A bereaved person needs time to work through their sorrow .
