penance Impose a penance on.

He had done public **penance** for those hasty words.

penitence Remorse for your past conduct.

A public display of **penitence**.

penitent forgiveness from God.

A penitent expression.

penitential Relating to or expressing penitence or penance.

Wrote a **penitential** letter apologizing for her hasty words.

An unfortunate development.

It s a **pity** you didn t contact us first.

professTeach a subject as a professor.

Though knowing little of the arts I **profess**ed he proved a natural adept.

regret Express with regret.

Any inconvenience to readers is **regret**ted.

Feeling or expressing regret or sorrow or a sense of loss over something done

regretful or undone.

Regretful over mistakes she had made.

regrettable (of conduct or an event) giving rise to regret; undesirable; unwelcome.

It s **regrettable** that she didn t go to college.

A feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed.

They were filled with **remorse** and shame.

remorseful Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses.

The defendant was **remorseful** for what he had done.

repent View or think of (an action or omission) with deep regret or remorse.

Marian came to **repent** her hasty judgement.

repentance The action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse.

Each person who turns to God in genuine **repentance** and faith will be saved.

Feeling or expressing remorse for misdeeds.

repentant
He is truly repentant for his incredible naivety and stupidity.

Bitterly regret (something one has done or allowed to happen) and wish it

rue undone.

With **rue** my heart is laden.

rueful Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses.

She gave a **rueful** grin.

sceptic A person who doubts the truth of Christianity and other religions; an atheist.

A person who sins (without repenting. *God forgives repentant sinners.*

A bereaved person needs time to work through their **sorrow**.
