# Regurgitate as a Verb

### Definitions of "Regurgitate" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "regurgitate" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Feed through the beak by regurgitating previously swallowed food.
- Pour or rush back.
- Repeat after memorization.
- (of a fluid) flow through a vessel or valve in the body in a direction opposite to normal.
- Repeat (information) without analysing or comprehending it.
- Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth.
- Bring (swallowed food) up again to the mouth.





## Synonyms of "Regurgitate" as a verb (29 Words)

**be sick** Occupy a certain position or area.

**bring up** Induce or persuade.

Form by pouring e g wax or hot metal into a cast or mold.

Cast lots.

Raise an anchor from the surface of the water to the cathead.

I kept her off the wind and sailing free until I had the anchor  ${\it cat}$ ted.

**chuck** Throw (something) away.

Many would **chuck** it all if it was financially feasible.

disgorge (of a river) empty into a sea.

honk Make or cause to make a honk.

**purge** Excrete or evacuate (someone's bowels or body.

recite Recite in elocution.

Bring up again; disgorge.

**regorge** The least east wind makes their waters **regorge** and overspread a vast

rehearse Supervise (a performer or group) during a rehearsal.

He had **rehearse**d a thousand fine phrases.

. To say, state, or perform again.

reiterate

She reiterated that the government would remain steadfast in its support.

Repeat an earlier theme of a composition.

The thirteen episodes from the first two series were constantly **repeat**ed.

(of an organism) produce offspring by a sexual or asexual process.

reproduce

These bacteria reproduce.

To say, state, or perform again.

restate

He restated his opposition to abortion.

retch Make an unsuccessful effort to vomit; strain to vomit.

The sour taste in her mouth made her **retch**.

**say again** Communicate or express nonverbally.

**sick** Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth.

He was passing blood and **sick**ing it up.

Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth.

He felt faint and nauseous he had to get out before he **spew**ed.

**spue** Expel or eject (saliva or phlegm or sputum) from the mouth.

**throw up** Move violently, energetically, or carelessly.



upchuck Vomit.

I almost **upchuck**ed my toasted marshmallows.

**vomit up** Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth.

### Usage Examples of "Regurgitate" as a verb

• The patient regurgitated the food we gave him last night.

- Gulls regurgitate food for the chicks.
- The blood regurgitates into the heart ventricle.
- An incompetent mitral valve allows blood to regurgitate into the left atrium throughout ventricular contraction.
- The regurgitated remains of their meals.
- Facts which can then be regurgitated at examinations.
- For the exam, you must be able to regurgitate the information.
