## **Regurgitate as a Verb**

## **Definitions of "Regurgitate" as a verb**

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "regurgitate" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Feed through the beak by regurgitating previously swallowed food.
- Pour or rush back.
- Repeat after memorization.
- (of a fluid) flow through a vessel or valve in the body in a direction opposite to normal.
- Repeat (information) without analysing or comprehending it.
- *Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth.*
- Bring (swallowed food) up again to the mouth.





## Synonyms of "Regurgitate" as a verb (29 Words)

be sick	Occupy a certain position or area.
bring up	Induce or persuade.
<u>cast</u>	Form by pouring e g wax or hot metal into a cast or mold. <i>Cast lots.</i>
cat	Raise an anchor from the surface of the water to the cathead. I kept her off the wind and sailing free until I had the anchor <b>cat</b> ted.
<u>chuck</u>	Throw (something) away. Many would <b>chuck</b> it all if it was financially feasible.
disgorge	(of a river) empty into a sea. The Nile <b>disgorge</b> s into the sea at Rashid.
honk	Make or cause to make a honk. Fans <b>honk</b> ed their horns.



iterate	Make repeated use of a mathematical or computational procedure, applying it each time to the result of the previous application; perform iteration. <i>The bird s call is a monotonously <b>iterate</b>d single note.</i>
parrot	Repeat mindlessly. The students <b>parrot</b> ed the teacher s words.
puke	Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth. <i>He <b>puke</b>d up his pizza.</i>
purge	Excrete or evacuate (someone's bowels or body. <b>Purge</b> the old gas tank.
recapitulate	Summarize briefly. Many features of regeneration in the peripheral nervous system <b>recapitulate</b> development.
<u>recite</u>	Recite in elocution. <i>Recite</i> a poem.
regorge	Bring up again; disgorge. The least east wind makes their waters <b>regorge</b> and overspread a vast extent of level ground.
rehearse	Supervise (a performer or group) during a rehearsal. <i>He had <b>rehearse</b>d a thousand fine phrases.</i>
reiterate	To say, state, or perform again. She <b>reiterate</b> d that the government would remain steadfast in its support.
<u>repeat</u>	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. The thirteen episodes from the first two series were constantly <b>repeat</b> ed.
reproduce	(of an organism) produce offspring by a sexual or asexual process. <i>These bacteria</i> <b>reproduce</b> .
<u>restate</u>	To say, state, or perform again. <i>He <b>restate</b>d his opposition to abortion.</i>
retch	Make an unsuccessful effort to vomit; strain to vomit. The sour taste in her mouth made her <b>retch</b> .
say again	Communicate or express nonverbally.
sick	Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth. <i>He was passing blood and sicking it up.</i>
<u>spew</u>	Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth. <i>He felt faint and nauseous he had to get out before he <b>spew</b>ed.</i>
spue	Expel or eject (saliva or phlegm or sputum) from the mouth.
throw up	Move violently, energetically, or carelessly.



upchuck	Vomit. I almost <b>upchuck</b> ed my toasted marshmallows.
vomit up	Eject the contents of the stomach through the mouth.

## Usage Examples of "Regurgitate" as a verb

- The patient regurgitated the food we gave him last night.
- Gulls regurgitate food for the chicks.
- The blood regurgitates into the heart ventricle.
- An incompetent mitral value allows blood to regurgitate into the left atrium throughout ventricular contraction.
- The regurgitated remains of their meals.
- Facts which can then be regurgitated at examinations.
- For the exam, you must be able to regurgitate the information.
