### Definitions of "Reinforcement" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “reinforcement” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The action or process of reinforcing or strengthening.*
- *A stimulus that strengthens or weakens the behavior that produced it.*
- *A military operation (often involving new supplies of men and materiel) to strengthen a military force or aid in the performance of its mission.*
- *(psychology) a stimulus that strengthens or weakens the behavior that produced it.*
- *Extra personnel sent to increase the strength of an army or similar force.*
- *An act performed to strengthen approved behavior.*
- *The strengthening structure or material employed in reinforced concrete or plastic.*
- *The process of encouraging or establishing a belief or pattern of behaviour.*
- *A device designed to provide additional strength.*
- *Information that makes more forcible or convincing.*



## Synonyms of "Reinforcement" as a noun (24 Words)

<b>augmentation</b>	The statement of a theme in notes of greater duration (usually twice the length of the original). <i>The <b>augmentation</b> of the curriculum with new subjects.</i>
<b>auxiliaries</b>	Someone who acts as assistant.
<b>bolstering</b>	A pillow that is often put across a bed underneath the regular pillows.
<b>boosting</b>	The act of giving hope or support to someone.
<b>bracing</b>	A structural member used to stiffen a framework.
<b>building up</b>	The commercial activity involved in repairing old structures or constructing new ones.
<b>buttressing</b>	A support usually of stone or brick; supports the wall of a building.
<b>fortification</b>	Defensive structure consisting of walls or mounds built around a stronghold to strengthen it. <i>The building and maintenance of <b>fortifications</b>.</i>

<b>holding up</b>	Something owned; any tangible or intangible possession that is owned by someone.
<b>increase</b>	The amount by which something increases. <i>They proposed an <b>increase</b> of 15 percent in the fare.</i>
<b>propping up</b>	A support placed beneath or against something to keep it from shaking or falling.
<b>reinforcement</b>	Information that makes more forcible or convincing.
<b>reinforcer</b>	A stimulus that strengthens or weakens the behavior that produced it.
<b>reserves</b>	Civilians trained as soldiers but not part of the regular army.
<b>reward</b>	The offer of money for helping to find a criminal or for returning lost property. <i>A slap on the face was his <b>reward</b> for his cheek.</i>
<b>shoring up</b>	A beam or timber that is propped against a structure to provide support.
<b>stiffening</b>	The process of becoming stiff or rigid. <i><b>Stiffening</b> his shoulders he prepared to advance.</i>
<b>strengtheners</b>	A device designed to provide additional strength. <i>The cardboard backing was just a <b>strengtheners</b>.</i>
<b>strengthening</b>	The act of increasing the strength of something.
<b>supplementing</b>	Textual matter that is added onto a publication; usually at the end.
<b>support</b>	Supporting structure that holds up or provides a foundation. <i>The study provides <b>support</b> for both theories.</i>
<b>supporting</b>	The act of bearing the weight of or strengthening.
<b>swelling</b>	The undulating movement of the surface of the open sea. <i>Painless <b>swellings</b> may appear in the lower abdomen.</i>
<b><u>underpinning</u></b>	A set of ideas, motives, or devices which justify or form the basis for something. <i>The theoretical <b>underpinning</b> for free market economics.</i>

The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.

<b><u>brace</u></b>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>She <b>braced</b> her feet against a projecting shelf.</i>
<b>convoy</b>	A collection of merchant ships with an escort of warships. <i>A <b>convoy</b> of lorries.</i>
<b><u>deepen</u></b>	Become more intense. <i>They <b>deepened</b> the lake so that bigger pleasure boats could use it.</i>
<b>defence</b>	Protection from harm. <i>His first title <b>defence</b> against Jones.</i>
<b><u>defend</u></b>	Be the defense counsel for someone in a trial. <i>We shall <b>defend</b> our island whatever the cost.</i>
<b>defense</b>	(military) military action or resources protecting a country against potential enemies. <i>Sanitation is the best <b>defense</b> against disease.</i>
<b>defensible</b>	Able to be protected. <i>A morally <b>defensible</b> penal system.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Increase. <i>This sauce will <b>enhance</b> the flavor of the meat.</i>
<b><u>escalate</u></b>	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>We do not want to <b>escalate</b> the war.</i>
<b><u>fortify</u></b>	Add alcohol to (beverages). <i>Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.</i>
<b>guard</b>	The person who plays the position of guard on a basketball team. <i><b>Guard</b> against infection.</i>
<b><u>harden</u></b>	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>Wait for the glue to <b>harden</b>.</i>
<b>intensification</b>	The action of making or becoming more intense. <i>The <b>intensification</b> of the conflict.</i>
<b><u>intensify</u></b>	Increase the opacity of (a negative) using a chemical. <i>The dispute began to <b>intensify</b>.</i>
<b><u>military</u></b>	The military forces of a nation. <i>As a young man he joined the <b>military</b> and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
<b>missile</b>	A weapon that is self-propelled or directed by remote control, carrying conventional or nuclear explosive. <i>One of the players was hit on the head by a <b>missile</b> thrown by a spectator.</i>
<b>protect</b>	Preserve or guarantee by means of formal or legal measures. <i>Weatherbeater <b>protects</b> your roof from the rain.</i>

<b><u>reinforce</u></b>	Strengthen (a military force) with additional personnel or equipment. <i>The next few months <b>reinforced</b> my opinion of Vince as a man of his word.</i>
<b>safeguard</b>	Protect from harm or damage with an appropriate measure. <i>The charity called for tougher <b>safeguards</b> to protect Britain's remaining natural forests.</i>
<b><u>soldier</u></b>	Serve as a soldier. <i>I <b>soldiered</b> with your father on his last four campaigns.</i>
<b><u>steel</u></b>	Cover plate or edge with steel. <i>Nerves of <b>steel</b>.</i>
<b>strengthen</b>	Make or become stronger. <i>This exercise will <b>strengthen</b> your upper body.</i>
<b>support</b>	Give moral or psychological support aid or courage to. <i>Air operations in <b>support</b> of British forces.</i>
<b><u>sword</u></b>	One of the suits in a tarot pack. <i>Not many perished by the <b>sword</b>.</i>
<b>tenable</b>	(of an office, position, scholarship, etc.) able to be held or used. <i>A scholarship of 200 per annum <b>tenable</b> for three years.</i>
<b><u>territorial</u></b>	A territorial military unit. <i>Strongly <b>territorial</b> birds.</i>
<b>toughen</b>	Make or become stronger or more resilient. <i>A falcon has scaly skin on its legs that <b>toughens</b> up very quickly.</i>
<b><u>weapon</u></b>	A means of persuading or arguing. <i>Nuclear <b>weapons</b>.</i>
