### **Definitions of "Reinforces" as a verb**

## Synonyms of "Reinforces" as a verb (2 Words)

**reenforce** Make stronger.

**reward** Bestow honor or rewards upon.  
*The scout was **rewarded** for courageous action.*





## Usage Examples of "Reinforces" as a verb

- *He reinforced the concrete.*
- *Let's reinforce good behavior.*





## Associations of "Reinforces" (30 Words)

- bolster** Prop up with a pillow or bolster.  
*They **bolstered** the seats for a more comfortable ride.*
- bond** Issue bonds on.  
*Assets may have to be sold or **bonded** to provide cash for the payment of this tax.*
- brace** Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace.  
*Police are **braced** for a traffic nightmare today.*
- calcify** Convert into lime.  
*These elements would **calcify** as rock.*
- cooperation** The formation and operation of cooperatives.  
*They agreed on a policy of **cooperation**.*

<b>deepen</b>	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>They <b>deepened</b> the lake so that bigger pleasure boats could use it.</i>
<b>defensible</b>	Able to be protected. <i>A morally <b>defensible</b> penal system.</i>
<b>development</b>	A state in which things are improving; the result of developing (as in the early part of a game of chess). <i>He proposed an indicator of osseous <b>development</b> in children.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This will <b>enhance</b> your enjoyment.</i>
<b>escalate</b>	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>The disturbance <b>escalated</b> into a full scale riot.</i>
<b>exacerbate</b>	Make worse. <i>The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only <b>exacerbated</b> the problem.</i>
<b>fortify</b>	Increase the nutritional value of (food) by adding vitamins or minerals. <i>Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.</i>
<b>harden</b>	Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate. <i>As oil prices <b>hardened</b> from their recent lows the US dollar fell.</i>
<b>heighten</b>	Increase the height of. <i>Pot smokers claim it <b>heightens</b> their awareness.</i>
<b>increase</b>	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The amount of work <b>increased</b>.</i>
<b>intensification</b>	The act of increasing the contrast of (a photographic film). <i>The <b>intensification</b> of the conflict.</i>
<b>intensify</b>	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>The dispute began to <b>intensify</b>.</i>
<b>intension</b>	The internal content of a concept.
<b>intensity</b>	The quality of being intense. <i>The pain grew in <b>intensity</b>.</i>
<b>ossify</b>	Make rigid and set into a conventional pattern. <i>These tracheal cartilages may <b>ossify</b>.</i>
<b>reinforcement</b>	A stimulus that strengthens or weakens the behavior that produced it. <i>A small force would hold the position until <b>reinforcements</b> could be sent.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise up. <i>Christ is <b>risen</b>.</i>
<b>sharpen</b>	Raise the pitch of (a note) by a semitone. <i>We had to <b>sharpen</b> our arguments.</i>



<b>stiffen</b>	Support or strengthen (a garment or fabric), typically by adding tape or an adhesive layer. <i><b>Stiffen</b> the regulations.</i>
<b>strength</b>	The potential of a hand to win tricks, arising from the number and type of high cards it contains. <i>The <b>strength</b> of the company's stock in recent weeks.</i>
<b>strengthen</b>	Give a healthy elasticity to. <i>The wind won't <b>strengthen</b> until after dark.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Strong and sure. <i>Driving on these motorways requires <b>strong</b> nerves.</i>
<b><u>stronghold</u></b>	A place that has been fortified so as to protect it against attack. <i>Their mountain <b>strongholds</b> fell to enemy attack.</i>
<b>toughen</b>	Make or become stronger or more resilient. <i>He tried to <b>toughen</b> his son up by sending him to public school.</i>
<b><u>widening</u></b>	An increase in width.
