Synonyms of "Reinforces" as a verb (2 Words)

reenforce Make stronger.

reward Bestow honor or rewards upon.
*The scout was **rewarded** for courageous action.*



Usage Examples of "Reinforces" as a verb

- *He reinforced the concrete.*
- *Let's reinforce good behavior.*



Associations of "Reinforces" (30 Words)

- bolster** Prop up with a pillow or bolster.
*They **bolstered** the seats for a more comfortable ride.*
- bond** Issue bonds on.
*Assets may have to be sold or **bonded** to provide cash for the payment of this tax.*
- brace** Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace.
*Police are **braced** for a traffic nightmare today.*
- calcify** Convert into lime.
*These elements would **calcify** as rock.*
- cooperation** The formation and operation of cooperatives.
*They agreed on a policy of **cooperation**.*

deepen	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>They deepened the lake so that bigger pleasure boats could use it.</i>
defensible	Able to be protected. <i>A morally defensible penal system.</i>
development	A state in which things are improving; the result of developing (as in the early part of a game of chess). <i>He proposed an indicator of osseous development in children.</i>
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This will enhance your enjoyment.</i>
escalate	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>The disturbance escalated into a full scale riot.</i>
exacerbate	Make worse. <i>The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only exacerbated the problem.</i>
fortify	Increase the nutritional value of (food) by adding vitamins or minerals. <i>Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.</i>
harden	Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate. <i>As oil prices hardened from their recent lows the US dollar fell.</i>
heighten	Increase the height of. <i>Pot smokers claim it heightens their awareness.</i>
increase	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The amount of work increased.</i>
intensification	The act of increasing the contrast of (a photographic film). <i>The intensification of the conflict.</i>
intensify	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>The dispute began to intensify.</i>
intension	The internal content of a concept.
intensity	The quality of being intense. <i>The pain grew in intensity.</i>
ossify	Make rigid and set into a conventional pattern. <i>These tracheal cartilages may ossify.</i>
reinforcement	A stimulus that strengthens or weakens the behavior that produced it. <i>A small force would hold the position until reinforcements could be sent.</i>
rise	Rise up. <i>Christ is risen.</i>
sharpen	Raise the pitch of (a note) by a semitone. <i>We had to sharpen our arguments.</i>

stiffen	Support or strengthen (a garment or fabric), typically by adding tape or an adhesive layer. <i>Stiffen the regulations.</i>
strength	The potential of a hand to win tricks, arising from the number and type of high cards it contains. <i>The strength of the company's stock in recent weeks.</i>
strengthen	Give a healthy elasticity to. <i>The wind won't strengthen until after dark.</i>
strong	Strong and sure. <i>Driving on these motorways requires strong nerves.</i>
<u>stronghold</u>	A place that has been fortified so as to protect it against attack. <i>Their mountain strongholds fell to enemy attack.</i>
toughen	Make or become stronger or more resilient. <i>He tried to toughen his son up by sending him to public school.</i>
<u>widening</u>	An increase in width.
