
Reinforces as a Verb

- Make stronger.






Synonyms of "Reinforces" as a verb (2 Words)

reenforce Make stronger.

reward Bestow honor or rewards upon. *The scout was rewarded for courageous action.*





Usage Examples of "Reinforces" as a verb

- He reinforced the concrete.
- Let's reinforce good behavior.





Associations of "Reinforces" (30 Words)

bolster	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. They bolster ed the seats for a more comfortable ride.
bond	Issue bonds on. Assets may have to be sold or bond ed to provide cash for the payment of this tax.
<u>brace</u>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>Police are braced for a traffic nightmare today.</i>
calcify	Convert into lime. These elements would calcify as rock.
cooperation	The formation and operation of cooperatives. They agreed on a policy of cooperation .



<u>deepen</u>	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. They deepen ed the lake so that bigger pleasure boats could use it.
defensible	Able to be protected. A morally defensible penal system.
development	A state in which things are improving; the result of developing (as in the early part of a game of chess. <i>He proposed an indicator of osseous</i> development <i>in children</i> .
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This will enhance your enjoyment.</i>
<u>escalate</u>	Make or become more intense or serious. The disturbance escalate d into a full scale riot.
exacerbate	Make worse. <i>The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only</i> exacerbate <i>d the problem.</i>
<u>fortify</u>	Increase the nutritional value of (food) by adding vitamins or minerals. Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.
<u>harden</u>	Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate. As oil prices harden ed from their recent lows the US dollar fell.
heighten	Increase the height of. Pot smokers claim it heighten s their awareness.
increase	A change resulting in an increase. The amount of work increase d.
intensification	The act of increasing the contrast of (a photographic film. <i>The intensification</i> of the conflict.
intensify	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>The dispute began to intensify.</i>
intension	The internal content of a concept.
<u>intensity</u>	The quality of being intense. <i>The pain grew in intensity.</i>
ossify	Make rigid and set into a conventional pattern. These tracheal cartilages may ossify .
<u>reinforcement</u>	A stimulus that strengthens or weakens the behavior that produced it. A small force would hold the position until reinforcement s could be sent.
rise	Rise up. <i>Christ is risen.</i>
<u>sharpen</u>	Raise the pitch of (a note) by a semitone. We had to sharpen our arguments.



stiffen	Support or strengthen (a garment or fabric), typically by adding tape or an adhesive layer. Stiffen the regulations.
strength	The potential of a hand to win tricks, arising from the number and type of high cards it contains. The strength of the company s stock in recent weeks.
strengthen	Give a healthy elasticity to. The wind won t strengthen until after dark.
strong	Strong and sure. Driving on these motorways requires strong nerves.
<u>stronghold</u>	A place that has been fortified so as to protect it against attack. Their mountain stronghold s fell to enemy attack.
toughen	Make or become stronger or more resilient. He tried to toughen his son up by sending him to public school.
widening	An increase in width.
