## Reinstatement as a Verb

### Definitions of "Reinstatement" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “reinstatement” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Bring back into original existence, use, function, or position.*
- *Restore (someone or something) to their former position or state.*
- *Restore to the previous state or rank.*

### Synonyms of "Reinstatement" as a verb (10 Words)

<b>bring back</b>	Go or come after and bring or take back.
<b>put back</b>	Adapt.
<b>reestablish</b>	Bring back into original existence, use, function, or position. <b>Reestablish</b> peace in the region.
<b>rehabilitate</b>	Return (something, especially a building or environmental feature) to its former condition. <i>The prisoner was successfully <b>rehabilitated</b>.</i>
<b>reinstall</b>	Place or fix (equipment or machinery) in position again. <i>One of his former students was <b>reinstalled</b> as president.</i>

<b>reinstitute</b>	Institute or introduce again. <i>By reinstituting conscription they could alienate a new generation of American youth.</i>
<b>replace</b>	Provide a substitute for (something that is broken, old, or inoperative). <i>We need to <b>replace</b> the secretary that left a month ago.</i>
<b>restore</b>	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i><b>Restore</b> law and order.</i>
<b>return to a former position</b>	Give or supply.
<b>return to power</b>	Give or supply.

## Usage Examples of "Reinstate" as a verb

- *The union threatened strike action if Owen was not reinstated.*

## Associations of "Reinstate" (30 Words)

<b>creativity</b>	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage <b>creativity</b>.</i>
<b>reanimate</b>	Restore to life or consciousness; revive. <i>His personal dislike of the man was <b>reanimated</b>.</i>
<b>rebuild</b>	An instance of rebuilding. <i>We try to help them <b>rebuild</b> their lives.</i>
<b>recast</b>	Present or organize in a different form or style. <i>There were moves to <b>recast</b> the play.</i>
<b>reclaim</b>	The action or process of reclaiming or being reclaimed. <i>Much of the Camargue has now been <b>reclaimed</b>.</i>
<b>reconstitute</b>	Change the form and organization of (an institution). <i>He <b>reconstituted</b> his cabinet.</i>
<b>reconstruct</b>	Reorganize (something). <i>From copies of correspondence it is possible to <b>reconstruct</b> the broad sequence of events.</i>
<b>reconstruction</b>	Recall that is hypothesized to work by storing abstract features which are then used to construct the memory during recall. <i>The economic <b>reconstruction</b> of Russia.</i>

<b>recover</b>	Get or find back recover the use of. <i>You ll be fully <b>recovered</b> before you know it.</i>
<b>reestablish</b>	Bring back into original existence, use, function, or position. <i><b>Reestablish</b> peace in the region.</i>
<b>reforestation</b>	The process of replanting an area with trees. <i>A massive <b>reforestation</b> project to renew soil fertility.</i>
<b>refurbish</b>	Renovate and redecorate (something, especially a building). <i>We <b>refurbished</b> the guest wing.</i>
<b>regain</b>	Come upon after searching; find the location of something that was missed or lost. <i>He soon <b>regained</b> his composure.</i>
<b>regenerate</b>	(of an organ or tissue) grow again. <i>The money will be used to <b>regenerate</b> the heart of the town.</i>
<b>rejuvenate</b>	Cause (a stream or river) to erode, as by an uplift of the land. <i>The exercise and fresh air <b>rejuvenated</b> me.</i>
<b>rejuvenation</b>	The action or process of giving new energy or vigour to something. <i>Experts in the art of facial <b>rejuvenation</b>.</i>
<b>remodel</b>	Cast or model anew. <i>The station was <b>remodelled</b> and enlarged in 1927.</i>
<b>renovate</b>	Make brighter and prettier. <i>This will <b>renovate</b> my spirits.</i>
<b>reproduce</b>	Repeat after memorization. <i>This DVD player <b>reproduces</b> the sound of the piano very well.</i>
<b>resilience</b>	The physical property of a material that can return to its original shape or position after deformation that does not exceed its elastic limit. <i>Nylon is excellent in wearability abrasion resistance and <b>resilience</b>.</i>
<b>restore</b>	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i><b>Restore</b> the emperor to the throne.</i>
<b>restructure</b>	Convert (the debt of a business in difficulty) into another kind of debt, typically one that is repayable at a later time. <i>A plan to strengthen and <b>restructure</b> the EC.</i>
<b>resuscitate</b>	Return to consciousness. <i>An ambulance crew tried to <b>resuscitate</b> him.</i>
<b>retrieve</b>	Recall knowledge from memory; have a recollection. <i>Steven stooped and <b>retrieved</b> his hat.</i>
<b>revitalize</b>	Restore strength. <i>This food <b>revitalized</b> the patient.</i>

<b>revive</b>	Be brought back to life, consciousness, or strength. <i>She <b>revived</b> after the doctor gave her an injection.</i>
<b><u>summon</u></b>	Authoritatively call on (someone) to be present as a defendant or witness in a law court. <i>A waiter was <b>summoned</b>.</i>
<b>vim</b>	A healthy capacity for vigorous activity. <i>In his youth he was full of <b>vim</b> and vigour.</i>
<b>vivify</b>	Make more striking or animated. <i>Outings <b>vivify</b> learning for children.</i>
<b>writ</b>	A form of written command in the name of a court or other legal authority to act or abstain from acting in a particular way. <i>The two reinstated officers issued a <b>writ</b> for libel against the applicants.</i>
